# Things to Know for Curbside Pick-Up of Unwanteds

The vast majority of Orwigsburg Borough residents take personal pride in maintaining a safe, attractive and healthy community, respectful of one another and welcoming to visitors.

Remember to respect your neighbors and to lend assistance, if needed, when storing and then placing trash and recycling containers for collection.

The Borough requires that all waste receptacles be stored behind or to the side of your property. Particularly, we ask that trash and its receptacles not be stored along any property side that faces a sidewalk.

Please see the rules below and the Borough website, *Orwigsburg.gov*, for schedules and information.

### Refuse/recycling collection

The Borough contracts with County Waste for the weekly refuse and biweekly recycling collection. Curbside pickup is on Tuesday for properties on Market Street and north ... and on Friday for properties south of Market Street.

Keep Orwigsburg Beautiful! Residents are asked to be considerate of the "streetscape" in front of their properties. Store your refuse and recycling containers to the rear or side of your building out-of-sight for neighbors and passers-by.

Ensure that your containers are closed and secure to avoid scattering by wind or animals.

# How do holidays affect trash/recycling?

County Waste observes six major holidays – Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day – that may change the normal Tuesday/Friday collections.

Here are the simple Holiday Schedule Rules:

- If the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday, trash/recycling pickup will be delayed one day for every household ... Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday; Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Wednesday thru Friday, the Tuesday pickup will not be affected; but, the Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Saturday or Sunday, the normal Tuesday and Friday pickups will not be affected.

Labor Day, of course, is always observed on a Monday – this year on Sept. 6. Normal Tuesday collection will be delayed until Wednesday, Sept. 8; normal Friday collection will be on Saturday, Sept.11.

### Recycling electronics

Federal law prohibits landfill disposal of desktop computers, laptops, monitors and peripherals, and televisions. These electronics must be recycled during special collection events or arranged privately (usually at a cost) with companies offering responsible electronics recycling.

Recycling sources for electronics and other household hazardous waste can be found on the Schuylkill County government website. Search for Office of Solid Waste & Resource Management.

County Waste will not take these in normal refuse or recycling collection.

Schuylkill County conducts a Fall Clean-up that allows residents to dispose of large items at a number of drop-off locations. Unfortunately, the County collection has not included electronics for several years.

### Monthly large item pickup

One large item (furniture, etc.) may be placed at the curb beside your regular trash once per month. The collection date is the second Tuesday of each

month for residents on Market Street and north ... and the Friday following the second Tuesday for residents south of Market Street.



Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, County Waste, at 800-832-1332.

# Chipping Away at Infrastructure & Stormwater Needs

The COVID pandemic has slowed to a crawl; even as new strains of this virus spread. Currently, the Borough is operating at a "new normal" nature. We are open daily for business. We now have our

monthly Borough Council meetings fully opened to the public. Street, water, sewer work, and other projects in the Borough are progressing.

Work on the exterior of Orwigsburg Borough Hall is underway. This year a planned "face-lift" of the west side of the building along with a chimney repair, were joined with roof repairs needed following a severe storm in June.

# Infrastructure in the Borough

Water, sewer, and stormwater are being coordinated and completed as materials become available. COVID has put a major strain on supplies that are needed for projects.

The Sewage Treatment Plant is undergoing upgrades in two phases – Phase 1 has already started and Phase 2 is slated for later this summer. The Maintenance Department has been marking, millingout, and filling potholes. Again, this is going to be a long process. Sewer line replacements are planned, as are new stormwater pipe improvements.

# Hard look at stormwater drainage

Stormwater projects will be under construction soon.

As many will recall, the storm on June 9 dumped nearly six inches of rain on Orwigsburg within an hour of time. This led to flooding of many areas of the Borough, including areas of elevation. The underlying cause of this flooding, other than the significant amount of rain estimated to be a 25-to-40-year storm, are the bottlenecks of restricted culverts at Ridge Road, West Market Street and Long Avenue.

The Borough is working to upgrade these areas of undersized pipe restrictions to allow for higher capacities. This takes time, however, requiring permission from DEP, PennDOT, and the Schuylkill Conservation District. In addition, the Borough has begun a "long-term" engineering design and is applying for grant funding from the federal government. The design would be to hold back rising flood waters, at some location up-stream during the storm event, and slowly release these waters after the event.

Borough Council has gone back to having twice a month meetings. The first Wednesday of each month is for work session discussions. The second Wednesday is for moving and voting on the previous week's discussions. Both meetings begin at 7 p.m. and are open to the public. At some point in the future if COVID numbers again start to spike, Borough Council along with input from myself and the health agencies of the Commonwealth, meetings might again revert to Zoom simulcasts.

During these hot days of summer, I ask that all residents keep an eye out for each of their neighbors, especially the elderly and infirmed. It only takes a few minutes to check on them.

Greetings, residents and friends of Orwigsburg! He's been on the job for more than a month now. News and social media have run articles/posts announcing his position. But, as this communication

reaches every Orwigsburg household, I'd like to take this opportunity to ask you to join me in welcoming and congratulating Vince McDonald on his selection to serve as Chief of our Police Department.

Vince has been a professional peace officer since 1993, when he started under the guidance of Chief Brozana as a part-time patrolman in Orwigsburg. After serving in Tremont and Hegins, he became a full-time officer with the Schuylkill Haven Police Department

in 2002. There, Vince performed various duties, including instructing the D.A.R.E. program for second, fourth, and sixth grade students in Schuylkill Haven Area schools. He is further involved with community

youth, having coached basketball, flag football, and soccer.

The path to Chief McDonald's June 21 oath of office was challenging. The Borough began a very thorough selection process in February of this year, receiving 23 well-qualified applications. Ten candidates checked all the boxes regarding our published advertisement. Nine were interviewed and scored by our selection board staffed by retired District Judge Jim Ferrier, retired and former Schuylkill Haven Chief Bob Schaeffer, Assistant District Attorney A.J. Serina, and Orwigsburg Civil Service board member Mike Malone.

Their dedicated efforts resulted in three candidates recommended to Council for consideration. Following Council's interviews of the candidates, Chief McDonald was offered the position. After clearing standard pre-employment hurdles, Vince hit the ground running.

Vince's approach is to be a visible and engaged leader. Expect to see him around town frequently as he acclimates to Orwigsburg and its citizens.

Feel free to offer your comments as he enjoys nothing more than learning the town's concerns and developing solutions. I look forward to what I expect to be Chief McDonald's very productive service to our Borough.






# Veterans Community Memorial Hall

# \$750K Grant Is Approved; Work Should Begin In 2022

Orwigsburg Borough received the formal grant agreement electronically in March for the RACP Grant, indicating the final approval of the grant was imminent. The Borough signed and returned a hardcopy for acceptance and signature by the Office of the Budget.

This began the final signature process of required agencies' approval for a fully executed grant. Special thanks again to PA State Representative Jerry Knowles who championed the process.

An online meeting between the Borough of Orwigsburg, the Veterans

Memorial Development Taskforce and Alfred Benesch was held on April 7. The coordination efforts are important to maximize the \$750,000 grant to the remaining scope prioritized by the Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce. The Borough and the Taskforce have worked over the last three months to prepare final documents ready for bid.

These efforts have required patience since the two processes are intertwined to assure all aspects of the RACP were deemed eligible expenses, the maximum number of desired renovation elements are approved and achieved, and that the Taskforce funds can be appropriated to complete the remainder of the project elements not authorized in the RACP process.

The original intent of the building from its conception in the late 1940s to its dedication in 1950, through today, continues to be to honor and commemorate the great service of our Veterans, in the Veterans Foyer of Honor and through the completion of the renovations.

# Work to move forward

The design will include the Veterans Honor Board, organized by named conflict, a Veterans Memorial Donor Board to recognize the major contributors to the renovations, initiated in 2005, various Veteran murals, a conflict timeline and display cases for Veteran and conflict memorabilia to be displayed. Eventually the original Schuylkill County Court House clock, which was once housed on a chimney tower of the origi-





nal 1950 Veterans C o m m u n i t y Memorial Hall, will be proudly displayed in the Veterans Foyer, following restoration by the O r w i g s b u r g Masonic Lodge.

The Borough received the formal signed grant agreement from

the Commonwealth of PA on June 4, 2021 electronically, authorizing the project to be bid minimizing any risk to the Borough. Benesch is working with the Borough and the Task Force to have final documents ready for bid proposals. The coordinated core group anticipates having TMT Design's prefinal documents by July 2021.

Task Force members have spent considerable effort finalizing the names for the Veterans Honor Board, coordinating each veteran by conflict, and clarifying the contributors for the Donors Board. Levkulic Associates is finalizing the kitchen renovations and location of the propane gas tank.

A final bid package will be presented in August and issued in September. The project will be bid in the fall, but work may not start until the spring 2022. There is concern that certain construction items – like light poles – will be delayed due to availability. Postpandemic pricing has been coming in high due to contractor workload, amount of work available, and supply chain shortages. A delayed start, if necessary, might offset the short-term price increases.

### Private donations still needed

Because of this, the Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce is still seeking additional contributions to bring the project to successful completion for the continued use and enjoyment of the facility by the greater Orwigsburg community. Contributions are encouraged, sent to Orwigsburg Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce, P.O. Box 157, Orwigsburg, PA 17961.

The Taskforce was pleased to recently receive a \$10,000 contribution from an international manufacturer with a local plant employing a large number of workers. All contributions of any size will be graciously accepted and will assist in bringing the project to completion.

This has been a great public-private partnership in fundraising and in securing the necessary resources for this historic building restoration. The Orwigsburg Veterans Community Memorial Hall remains a one-of-a-kind facility in our greater Schuylkill County region. The Taskforce and Borough are committed to providing a completed community gathering place in honor and appreciation of our Veterans.

# Will It Take A Constitutional Amendment?

Eliminating unfair, archaic school property taxes and replacing those taxes with a fairer system of sup-

porting our public schools in Pennsylvania has been a goal for many local people for many years. When the Senate voted on my Senate Bill 76 to achieve this goal, it ended in a 24-24 tie, broken by the Lt. Governor who voted to kill the bill. Governor Wolf has also stated that he would veto any such proposal if it reached his desk.

A recent study by the Independent Fiscal Office illustrates how the burden of this school property

tax impacts people in different counties throughout Pennsylvania at greatly different rates by showing the average percentage of yearly income that was paid in school property taxes. Neighboring Berks County faced one of the highest burdens in the state, 4.4%, while Philadelphia County faced one of the lowest burdens at 2.1%. In Schuylkill County, the rate is 2.8%.

To put it simply, not every community in Pennsylvania feels the burden of high, unfair property taxes like we do. That simple fact has made it very difficult for us to obtain the votes of those low-property tax counties. Many powerful interest groups have also

joined Governor Wolf in opposing SB 76.

To break this long stalemate between the supporters and the opponents of our current system, I'm cosponsoring a new constitutional amendment to give voters the opportunity to eliminate all school property taxes via a ballot question. The best news: the Governor can't veto a constitutional amendment!!

# **Property Tax & Rent Rebate Program Deadline Extended**

The deadline to apply for Pennsylvania's Property Tax and Rent Rebate Program for tax year 2020 has been extended to Dec. 31.

Claimants are encouraged to file their rebate ap-

plications online by visiting *my-path.pa.gov*. The Department of Revenue launched the online portal to make it easier for those who benefit from the program to submit their applications. Previously, all applicants were required to submit a paper application.

The rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians, age 65 and older; widows and widowers, age 50 and older; and people with disabilities, age 18 and older. The income limit

is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, with half of Social Security income excluded. The maximum standard rebate is \$650, but supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975. Applications take four to six weeks to process.

Applicants are reminded they need not pay someone to file the forms. Copies of the forms, as well as free assistance with filing them, are available at my district office. My office is located at 202 E. Broad St., in Tamaqua.

Rebate claim forms are also available online at *www.revenue.pa.gov* or by calling, toll-free, 1-888-222-9190.

Since the program's inception in 1971, older adults and those with disabilities have received more than \$6.9 billion in property tax and rent relief. The program is funded by the Pennsylvania Lottery and revenue from slots gaming

### Permits and codes protect all

If you own property in Orwigsburg Borough or are a contractor or handyman doing work here, the Borough may require a permit for that new or repair/ replacement project. That permit is required if you hire someone to do the work as well as if it is a do-ityourself project on your private property.

Contrary to the beliefs of many, the Borough is not here to stop you from working on your private land. Codes and permits ensure that contractors and owners are not endangering other residential owners/ occupants, either to their properties or personally.

Likewise, the Borough wants to ensure, through standardized codes, that the hired contractor is completing the work in a standardly recognized manor.

It is always nice to see visual indicators of maintenance to homes and properties. However, sometimes appearance can be only "fresh-paint" covering if the substrate is not fixed correctly.

Failure to do these are public health violations as stipulated in Borough Ordinance 299 and subject to a fine up to \$600 for each offense.

The Orwigsburg Police Department has been made aware of this growing problem by inconsiderate resi-

dents. Neighbors and property owners witnessing these violations are urged to call the police at 570-366-3101 and file a complaint.

Many residents take advantage of the parks and walking trail and are discouraged by the lack of consideration shown by some pet owners. Homeowners in the Borough who take great pride when maintaining their properties feel violated when having to clean feces left by a passing dog or roaming cat when their masters seem oblivious to the community responsibilities of pet ownership.

# Don't flush sanitary wipes

When store shelves became empty of everyday items, such as toilet paper, use of "flushable" wipes, disinfection wipes, paper towels, and other cleaning supplies have been put into service during the health crisis.

Orwigsburg Borough wishes to remind all that wipes – even the ones that say "flushable" – and paper towels do not break down like toilet paper does in water. These items should never be flushed down your toilet; but, rather, should instead be thrown away with the trash.



Flushing of wipes and paper towels can cause raw wastewater backups in your home or neighborhood homes by wrapping around broken or misaligned drain pipe joints, thus forming a clog. If these items do pass through the system, they end up at the sewage treatment plant, causing mechanical breakdowns.

Flushing of wipes and paper towels has become a significant concern in recent times due to the shortage of toilet paper and the potential need to utilize alternate means combined with increased cleaning/disinfection recommendations by the CDC for prevention of COVID-19 and other viral respiratory illnesses

in households and community settings.

Only flush toilet paper and human waste down your toilet. All other items should be thrown away with your solid trash.

It is the responsibility of all property owners to pay their quarterly utility bills in full by the due date printed on the invoice.

# Take care of your property

Property owners must keep all premises and exterior property free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 6 inches. All noxious weeds are prohibited.

Weeds are defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs. This regulation, however, does not include cultivated flowers and gardens.

The property owner must also address weeds appearing between sidewalk blocks and between the curb and the street.

We use the Borough website *Orwigsburg.gov* as a valuable tool to keep residents and property owners informed about the happenings in the Borough. Our staff will keep the home page current with news on upcoming events and information on past events in the Borough.

A handy chart of typical recyclable items and a description of the overall program was distributed two years ago.

Compliance with these changes by most residents has significantly improved the quality of Orwigsburg's recycling. County Waste has requested that we follow three of the guidelines more closely.

- All items placed in the bin are to be loose, no bagging!
- No styrofoam; it is not a recyclable in their program.
- Be careful not to accidently put wet items, trash, or garbage in the recycle bin.

Spring and fall are good times to rinse out the recycle bin. Flush it out and let it dry before placing recyclables back in.




Whether you have been a church-goer for a long time, gotten out of the habit since your teenage years, or never been one at all, there are so many things going on here that we are excited to have you
