#### Newly elected officials

January 3, her fellow Councilors unanimously elected her to head the Council as President.

After all, change is hard and particularly for many, resorting to the old tried and true methods or "this is how we always have done it" are the safest and easiest paths.

But are they the most successful and what is needed for meaningful growth?

The biggest change from then to now is having Bob Williams as Borough Manager at the helm of our town's day-to-day operations. Thanks to Bob's leadership, I have found I have a much clearer perspective and grasp of the borough's budgeting process, our expenses, and our day-to-day cash flow.

His desire to bring transparency to our budget process, and our overall financial picture is a benefit to not only the council members who can make more informed decisions, but also to our residents who are increasingly expressing interest in how the borough works. How exciting for our community to see this energy and sense of purpose. It gives me hope the borough will continue to grow and thrive due to both our elected officials and our residents.

#### Budgeting for the town's best interest

We obviously can't talk about the budget without talking about Council's difficult, but necessary, decision to raise real estate taxes by 3 mills this year.

Much of Council's budget discussions surrounded the Police Department, commanded by Chief John Koury, and the need to properly staff and equip the officers to operate safely and approach 24/7 coverage. An aged and ailing police vehicle needed replacement and the substantial uptick in police-required incidents called for Council to take action. A new patrol vehicle has just been put into service and an additional police officer was hired last fall.

Addressing our aging infrastructure – water and sewer systems, storm drainage, and street maintenance/paving – required a 2018 budget commitment to ensure \$100,000 be directed to start the process. The local funding will be used to actively pursue state grant money to bolster priority improvements.

It wasn't all bad news as we prepared to move from 2017 to the new year. The Borough was fortunate to have higher revenues last year than expected, primarily due to higher activity in the real estate market. Additionally, a negotiated health insurance plan for our employees was showing considerable savings with \$29,015 over 3 years as well as \$8502 savings in our Municipal Workers Compensation Insurance.

So what does 2018 hold for the Borough? No one can say for sure, but I can assure the residents the Borough management and Council are doing everything they can to continue to give you quality borough services in the most cost effective methods possible.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve you and to serve as Council President. I welcome all residents to reach out to me with any questions or concerns and I look forward to providing you with important information in future issues of Happenings.

#### Borough holiday schedule

Orwigsburg Borough offices will be closed on March 30 in observance of Good Friday and on Monday, May 28 observing Memorial Day.

#### Trash/recycling moved from Square

At the request of residents and County Waste, the Borough's trash/recycling contractor, these remov-



al services will no longer take place from properties fronting on the Orwigsburg Square in the 100 blocks of East and West Market St. effective January 1 of this year.

The storage location of waste and recycling containers must be moved from the fronts of these properties. Removal servic-

es will be to the rear from Stephen Street on the south and Cherry Street on the north.

If moving your receptacles to the rear of the property is a challenge or hardship, contact Borough Hall at 570-366-3103 to explain your difficulty and determine the relocation.

County Waste provided collection from both fronts and rears of Square properties during the first two collection weeks of the new year to accommodate

this transition. As of this publication date, the new provisions will be enforced.

#### How do holidays affect trash/recycling?

County Waste, observes six major holidays – Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day – that may change the normal Tuesday/Friday collections.

#### Here are the simple Holiday Schedule Rules:

- If the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday, trash/recycling pickup will be delayed one day for every household ... Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday; Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Wednesday thru Friday, the Tuesday pickup will not be affected; but, the Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Saturday or Sunday, the normal Tuesday and Friday pickups will not be affected.

The next major holiday will be Memorial Day on Monday, May 28. Because the holiday falls on a Monday, the usual Tuesday pickup will be delayed to Wednesday, May 30, and the usual Friday pickup will be delayed to Saturday, June 2.

A handy Trash/Recycling Holiday Schedule card detailing the dates affected for 2018-2019 was mailed with the current Utility Billing in January. Additional

cards are available at Borough Hall, 209 N. Warren St., for anyone who did not receive it.

Declared "Snow Emergency"

The Borough last year reduced the number of designated "Snow Emergency" streets through Orwigsburg in order for the snow plow crews to efficiently stay ahead of major snowfalls. Fewer snow emergency

streets also mean less stress for many residents by not having to move their vehicles off the street right away ... and, if they are required, will have convenient streets allowing parking.

The designated "Snow Emergency" routes are: all of East and West Market streets, including both sides of Centre Square; South Liberty Street from Rt. 61 to Market, and North Washington Street from the blinker light to the Borough line.

During a snow and/or ice event, the Mayor of Orwigsburg may declare an official "Snow Emergency." Residents will be made aware of the emergency by notice posted to the borough website and Facebook page, through announcements on radio stations WPPA-AM and WAVT-FM, and by notice in the Republican Herald daily newspaper.

Households registered with the Borough's direct

notification system – Swiftreach 911 – will receive a phone call with a pre-recorded message from the Borough, an email, or text message depending on which method was requested. If you have not already done so, add your contact information via the Swiftreach link on the home page of the borough website: www.orwigsburg.net.

All vehicles parked on the designated "Snow Emergency" streets must be removed for a period of 24 hours once the emergency is declared or for a longer period as instructed.

Vehicles not removed, in violation of the emergency procedure, will be ticketed and will be towed. The vehicle owner is responsible for all towing costs. Ignorance of the declared emergency is not an excuse. It's your responsibility to find out.

#### Orwigsburg Town Survey

#### Now available - Credit/debit bill pay

As this newsletter is being published, the due date for quarterly utility bills is fast approaching. It is the responsibility of all property owners to pay their bills in full by the due date printed on the invoice.

Providing our residents with a higher level of customer service, Orwigsburg Borough now accepts credit and debit card payments for water, sewer, and trash service. Customers can make payments online at *www.orwigsburg.net* or at the Borough Office with major credit and debit cards.

The Borough utilizes the services of MuniciPAY with Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, or e-check. A user fee of 2.45% or \$3, whichever is greater, will be assessed per transaction. The fee for e-check is \$1.50.

Customers may continue to pay by cash, check or money order at the Borough Office, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Additionally, checks may be mailed to Orwigsburg Borough, 209 North Warren Street, Orwigsburg, PA 17961, or deposited in the 24/7 drop-off box located at the front door to Borough Hall.

Questions concerning these payment options may be directed to *kathi@orwigsburg.net* or call 570-366-3103.

The Borough relies on these payments in order to meet the debt service and operating costs for the water, wastewater and sanitation services. If a bill is not paid after a short grace period, collection efforts will be initiated. If efforts to collect payments are unsuccessful, additional steps could include interruption of service and/or a lien placed on your property. Property owners are responsible for all costs incurred to collect past due obligations.

To avoid these actions and additional costs, property owners must make payment arrangements with the Borough. Have accounts up to date or a payment arrangement in place by then to avoid loss of service.

Rental fee for the kitchen is \$75, \$25 of which is a returnable security deposit. If the kitchen is not needed, a \$25 fee is charged. Indoors, facilities at the Veterans Community Memorial Hall can be rented.

nings prior to collection. Because pickup times vary,

do not wait until the morning of collection to place garbage.

Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, County Waste, at 570-874-3047.

#### Rental properties

Orwigsburg Ordinance #396 and newly enacted Ordinance #424 establishes certain responsibilities for owners of rental properties in the Borough.



Every owner/lessor of any rental property, including but not limited to dwelling, dwelling units, rooming houses, rooming units, or dormitory rooms must register with the Borough each year between January 1 and February 28 identifying the tenants residing. If any tenant moves from the dwelling during the year, the owner shall notify the Borough within thirty (30) days of said changes. Forms are available at the Borough Office or can be printed from the borough website.

As part of the annual registration, a basic triennial (once every three years) inspection fee shall be paid for each and any dwelling unit ... \$110 for the first unit, \$45 for the second, and \$25 for each additional unit per address.


Owners/landlords living in excess of 20 miles from the Borough must designate a local manager for the property and provide all contact information. This individual must live within 10 miles of the Borough.

Property owners, landlords and tenants are asked to store trash and recycling containers at a location out of view from the front of the property. If necessary, the building code inspector shall identify such location.

#### Dumpster? You need a permit

Any resident who rents a dumpster and places it on the street is required to fill out a dumpster permit prior to dumpster delivery. Permits are available at the borough office at a cost of \$20. The permit is good for three weeks; another permit is required





for additional time. Four (4) reflectors are required on each side of the dumpster, and dumpster wheels must be placed on 3/4" thick pieces of wood so as not to damage the road surface.

#### Plan to reduce size of PA House

State Rep. Jerry Knowles reports he is the prime sponsor of House Bill 153, legislation that would reduce the size of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives from 203 to 151 members. Since this would involve a change to the Pennsylvania Constitution, a specific process must be followed. He provides this update:

In the previous 2015-16 session this same legislation passed in both the House and the Senate. Notification of the bill's passage was placed in two newspapers in every county throughout the state. House Bill 153 must now pass in both chambers again in the current 2017-18 session.

Once that occurs, notification will again appear in newspapers, and the measure will appear on the ballot as a referendum for voters to decide. Voters will make the final decision whether the House will consist of 151 or 203 legislators.

"I look forward to this bill being brought up for a vote this year, and I will continue to advocate for a smaller, more efficient state government," says Knowles.

The website lists borough meeting schedules. Minutes from these meetings are posted after they have been reviewed and approved by the appropri-



ate body. The subdivision and zoning codes are also available for all to view. Numerous forms can be accessed, including applications for Albright's Woods usage. Trash day pickup changes will also be posted. Links to other websites, such as the Lions Club, library, churches and fire company are on the website.

The website also includes a link allowing residents to enter their contact information into the borough's Swiftreach 911 emergency notification system. This site allows the Borough to notify residents via telephone, text message and email of boil water advisories, weather emergencies or any other emergencies in a prompt manner.

# Community Enforcement, Training and Safety for 2018

Your Orwigsburg Police Department has begun 2018 where last year left off, handling an increasing number of calls for assistance. Our department prides itself on maintaining Orwigsburg as a safe place in which to live and work.

Averaging about 217 calls per month.


Averaging about 217 calls per month, we ended 2017 with 2,608 calls for service. This number includes 231 crimes reported in the borough resulting in 107 arrests. As of the middle of January this year, we responded to 134 calls for service compared to only 98 through the same period last year.

Comparative numbers for 2017 have not yet been calculated by the FBI. In 1976 Orwigsburg accounted for just 2% of all crime occur-

ring in Schuylkill County.

While we are busier than ever handling calls, we made a renewed effort to be proactive in traffic enforcement. Last year we issued 272 traffic citations, an increase from 200 in 2016.

Our goal as a police department is compliance with traffic laws. Our visibility in traffic enforcement is not limited to only citations, having issued an additional 800 warnings last year. When motorists see us on a traffic stop, or monitoring traffic on the side of the road, they typically slow down and become more alert. This is the best possible outcome.



#### Certified to detect DUI offenses

Did you know all members of the Orwigsburg Police Department are certified as Standardized Field Sobriety Testing practitioners? This 24-hour

course is administered by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and instructs police officers how to detect signs of impairment from a person's driving and behavior.

In addition, officers are taught a battery of tests to determine if a motorist is capable of safely operating a vehicle. We also carry preliminary breath tests that are used to determine the presence of alcohol in a

person's body. These instruments use air from deep in a person's lungs and are not susceptible to being masked. Mouthwash, pennies, cigarettes, and hyperventilation are merely "urban myths" in how to beat the test results.

In 2016, our department arrested 17 for driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Last year, once all officers became certified, our DUI arrests doubled to 33. The moral to the story is to "Drive sober or get pulled over." Otherwise it will be the most expensive cab ride you've ever had.

#### Keeping our officers safe

Officers recently attended a seminar titled "Below 100." The goal of this four-hour class is to eliminate preventable line-of-duty deaths and reduce the total number of law enforcement deaths to below 100 – a number that hasn't been seen since 1943. The all-time high for officer deaths was 278 line-of-duty deaths in 1974.

Through increased awareness, training, and safety practices, that number has dramatically decreased to an average of 150 deaths per year over the last decade. This training reinforced five tenets – wear your seatbelt, wear your body armor, watch your speed, complacency kills, and What's Important Now (WIN)

The class helped to enhance our culture of safety in the Orwigsburg Police Department.



# Reforming our welfare system in Pennsylvania

As Chairman of the Senate Majority Policy Committee, one of the biggest issues my colleagues and I continue to tackle is welfare fraud and abuse in Pennsylvania. My goal regarding welfare reform is to end the abuse of the system so that we can save the state money and afford to provide additional assistance to those who are truly needy.



To date, many of the state's welfare fraud prevention initiatives have been successful. For example, based on figures provided by the Office of Inspector General for the 2016-17 Fiscal Year, the office saved approximately \$622,774 in Schuylkill County through various welfare fraud prevention initiatives. While these initiatives have generated significant cost savings for our region and the state, I do believe more needs to be done.

One reform initiative during the 2015-16 legislative session required the state to hire more investigators within the Office of Inspector General to combat welfare fraud, assist caseworkers with questionable applications, and address tips from the public. Unfortunately, the governor vetoed that plan as he has other reform proposals. I reintroduced a similar initiative this legislative session as Senate Bill 425.

Back in October 2017, the governor vetoed House Bill 59 which would have established a work requirement for able-bodied Medicaid recipients. The goal was to reduce costs in the long-term by encouraging recipients to find employment and become self-sufficient, rather than continue to rely upon the taxpayer.

Many local employers tell me they often have difficulty finding workers. I am hopeful this measure can be adopted in the future so we can enhance our job
