#### Opportunities Ahead Will Keep Orwigsburg Thriving

Orwigsburg Borough's year-end financial picture for 2019 was a winner, showing revenue outdistancing expenditures, enabling us to direct \$300,000 to "reserve accounts" to fund improvements to the Borough's infrastructure.

Our largest source of revenue each year comes from Property Taxes. Additional significant revenues come from Earned Income, and other Act 511 Taxes. Together, they account for 79.8% of the Borough's revenue.

Expenditures for 2019 were \$1,747,700

- the largest block of these costs in the General Fund is for the operation of our police department at \$693,500. Parks and Recreation, which includes Veterans Memorial Hall, amounts to \$167,500. The remainder of expenditures fund operations - tax collecting, financing, auditing, building maintenance, street and bridge maintenance, stormwater, snow removal, street cleaning, street lighting, traffic control, operating the fire department, and donations to various Borough organizations.

A number of Borough repairs are planned for this year – Borough Hall needs exterior work; storm water issues along Long Avenue and infrastructure improvements in other areas of town will be addressed; and the Ridgeview Development will get an overlay of the street where needed.

The Borough's contract with County Waste for the weekly collection and

years. This has worked to the Borough's benefit, but now a new contract needs to be negotiated for this service beginning in 2021. Higher costs for trash and recycling collection are expected due to the decline of the recycling industry and higher fuel and landfill costs.

The Water and Sewer accounts finished 2019 barely in the black overall, netting \$16,000 available at the begin-

ning of 2020. This amount is not nearly enough, in reserves, to make much-needed repairs to the systems.

Infiltration and Inflow (I&I) of ground and storm water from sump pumps, rain leaders, etc. is clean water that, when it enters the sewer lines, must be treated before being discharged from the sewer plant. There are efforts going on to help reduce this I&I; however, these corrections are not easily done and are expensive to accomplish.

The final point I would like to place before you is this. Development is coming to this region. The Borough needs to be vigilant in its responses to the flow of progress. There will be opportunities the Borough will need to pursue to keep the Borough thriving.



Street and north ... and the Friday following the second Tuesday for residents south of Market Street.

Residents should place trash at the curb anytime after 6 p.m. on evenings prior to collection. Because pickup times vary, do not wait until the morning of collection to place garbage.

Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb

with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, County Waste, at 570-874-3047.

#### Recycling and large item collection

Not sure when trash, recycling, and monthly large item collection will take place? The Borough website – *www.Orwigsburg.gov* – has monthly calendar pages with everything you need to know. Click on the "Services" tab, then on the "Garbage/Recycling file.

#### How do holidays affect trash/recycling?

County Waste, observes six major holidays – Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day – that may change the normal Tuesday/Friday collections

#### Here are the simple Holiday Schedule Rules:

- If the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday, trash/recycling pickup will be delayed one day for every household ... Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday; Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on
  Wednesday thru Friday, the
  Tuesday pickup will not be affected; but, the
  Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Saturday or Sunday, the normal Tuesday and Friday pickups will not be affected.

#### LIHEAP Help Available

Residents who are struggling with their home heating bills can apply for assistance from the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) now through April 10, 2020.

LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through



energy assistance grants. The program also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel, or termination of utility service.

The income eligibility guidelines for LIHEAP are set at 150% of the federal poverty income level. For example, the income limit for

an individual is \$18,735; for a couple, the limit is \$25,365; and for a family of four, it is \$38,625.

Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting the County Assistance Office. Or, stop by one of my offices if you need assistance with completing your LIHEAP application. My offices are located at 202 E. Broad St. in Tamagua and 61 N. 3rd St. in Hamburg.



The designated "Snow Emergency" routes are: all of East and West Market streets, including both sides of Centre Square; South Liberty Street from Rt. 61 to Market, North Warren Street from Market to Lehigh Avenue, and North Washington Street from the blinker light to the Borough line.

During a snow and/or ice event, the Mayor of Orwigsburg may declare an official "Snow Emergency." Residents will be made aware of the emergency by notice posted to the Borough website and Facebook page, through announcements on radio stations WPPA-AM and WAVT-FM, and by notice in the Republican Herald daily newspaper.

Households registered with the Borough's direct notification system - Swiftreach 911 - will receive a phone call with a pre-recorded message from the Borough, an email, or text message depending on which method was requested. If you have not already done so, add your contact information via the Swiftreach link on the home page of the Borough website: *Orwigsburg.gov*.

All vehicles parked on the designated "Snow Emergency" streets must be removed for a period of 24 hours once the emergency is declared or for a longer period as instructed.

Vehicles not removed, in violation of the emergency procedure, will be ticketed and will be towed. The vehicle owner is responsible for all towing costs. Ignorance of the declared emergency is not an excuse. It's your responsibility to find out.

#### Single Stream Recycling Program

The Borough and County Waste Recycling, LLC have prepared updated definitions of the items that can be recycled in our biweekly recycling collection program.

A handy chart of typical recyclable items and a description of the overall program can be found on the borough website – *Orwigsburg.gov* – under the "Services" tab. Select the "Garbage/Recycling" link. Printed copies are available at the Borough Office.



Since early 2018, the world-

wide recycle materials market has been in disarray. Only the best quality recycle stream sources are now acceptable. Putting anything and everything in the recycle containers is no longer acceptable. Please follow the new guidelines and clarifications.

The acceptability and/or preparation of some items has changed. Your cooperation in following these guidelines is needed to make the program practical and effective. Any future updates to the guidelines will be amended on the borough website.

Recycling and/or proper disposal of items not covered by our program may be found on the Schuylkill County Solid Waste website:

We have asked the county solid waste coordinator to update this site and to add more options for items with little known local recycling or reuse options.

#### Curb your animal

The Borough Office has received numerous complaints of pet owners walking their dogs and failing to clean up after defecation on both public and private property. Property owners, also, are reminded to pick up the feces of their own pets from their property within a reasonable time.



Both are public health violations as stipulated in Ordinance 299 and subject to a fine up to \$600 for each offense.

The Orwigsburg Police Department has been made aware of this growing problem by inconsiderate residents. Neighbors and property owners witnessing these violations are urged to call the police at 570-366-3101 and file a complaint. Many residents take advantage of the parks and walking trail

and are discouraged by the lack of consideration shown by some pet owners. Homeowners in the Borough who take great pride when maintaining their properties feel violated when having to clean feces left by a passing dog or roaming cat when their masters seem oblivious to the community responsibilities of pet ownership.

#### Rental properties

Orwigsburg Ordinance #432 establishes requirements for owners of rental properties in the Borough. This ordinance can be referenced on the Borough website: www.Orwigsburg.gov under "Government – Ordinances".

Every owner/lessor of any rental property, including but not limited to dwelling and dwelling units, must be registered with the Borough each year between January 1 and February 28, and upon any change in the occupancy of the property dwelling unit(s). Forms are available at the Borough Office or can be printed from the Borough website.

As part of the annual registration, a basic triennial (once every three years) inspection fee shall be paid for each and any dwelling unit ... \$140 for the first unit, \$75 for the second, and \$55 for each additional unit per address. Upon inspection approval for habitation, a Certificate of Occupancy will be issued. No person shall operate a rental property unless a valid certificate has been issued. Any newly designated rental unit is required to have an initial inspection at a cost of \$380.

Owners/landlords living in excess of 20 miles from the Borough must designate a local manager for the property and provide all contact information. This individual must live within 10 miles of the Borough.

All owners of rental units shall provide for and designate a location for storage of trash and recycling containers on the rental property to be an area other than the front of the property. If necessary, the building code inspector shall identify such location.

Additional requirements for owners and tenants are detailed in the ordinance.

#### Getting the word out



We use the Borough website *Orwigsburg. gov* as a valuable tool to keep residents and property owners informed about the happenings in the Borough. Our staff


will keep the home page current with news on upcoming events and information on past events in the Borough.

The website lists Borough meeting schedules. Minutes from these meetings are posted after they have been reviewed and approved by the appropriate body. The subdivision and zoning codes are also available for all to view. Numerous forms can be accessed, including applications for Albright's Woods usage. Trash day pickup changes will also be posted. Links to other websites, such as the Lions Club, library, churches and fire company are on the website.

The website also includes a link allowing residents to enter their contact information into the borough's Swiftreach 911 emergency notification system. This site allows the Borough to notify residents via telephone, text message and email of boil water advisories, weather emergencies or any other emergencies in a prompt manner.

#### **Veterans Community Memorial Hall**

#### Veterans Foyer Work to Begin Later This Year



The Orwigsburg Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce remains focused on working with the Borough of Orwigsburg for the completion of the Veterans Community Memorial renovation.

The project continues to have a dual funding stream. The first is continued community fundraising through personal, business and foundation donations and gifts. The second is government grants – most recently was a \$750,000 Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) approved by Governor Tom Wolf and championed by state Rep. Jerry Knowles, state Senator Dave Argall, and state representatives Neal Goodman and Mike Tobash.

Interim financing, needed to pay for work prior to reimbursement of the RACP grant monies funds, was gained in December 2019. The approved work covered by the grant consists of the Veterans Foyer / Hall of Honor interior improvements.

Bid documents for this work are expected to be released in the spring/summer timeframe of 2020. Construction is expected to take one year following contract award.

In total, using combined funds of the grant, Orwigsburg Borough, and locally raised amounts by the Taskforce, work yet to be done consists of interior improvements to the main gym area and meeting room. Acoustic panels for sound and audio-visual



enhancements for public presentations will be added.

Kitchen improvements include new utility connections, new appliances/equipment and improved storage, creating an approximate 500 sq. ft. catering kitchen.

Renovations will also increase ADA accessibility and site safety, enhance the community center recreation facilities, and provide for wider range of usage.

A permanent office and meeting space will be created for use by the local VFW and American Legion organizations.

A Veteran's Honor Board will recognize all known local veterans and allow for the addition of future names. Contributors to the Veterans Community Memorial Hall renovations since the inception of the project, including individuals, businesses and non-profits, will also be recognized.

#### Orwigsburg Police Department

#### Six Full Time Officers Protect Residents 24/7/366

Looking back on the year that was, the Orwigsburg Police Department had a busy 2019.

With Police Chief John Koury, a sixth full time officer – Patrick McBreen – was added to the departmet last February. The added officer has allowed us to drastically reduce overtime, at times allow for a second officer on duty, and fill shifts when officers are on training, vacation, or sick leave.

Business owners and residents should know the Orwigsburg Police serve 24 hours per day, seven days per week, and 365 days per year. (It will be 366 days in 2020, a Leap Year!)



This past December the department took delivery of a new patrol vehicle – a black 2020 Ford Explorer. This new vehicle will be fully marked with an a new graphics scheme. Unlike our "ghost lettered" unit, the graphics on this vehicle will be readily identifiable both day and night.

This gives the department three dedicated vehicles to utilize. Previously when we had events or a vehicle was out of service, we would need to use the borough manager's vehicle or even one of the vehicles utilized by the street department. The new vehicle will be set up with the same equipment as the other two units, including an in-car camera, computer, and AED.



Year-end log figures show a total of 3,176 incidents, an average of nearly nine calls per day. This activity compares similarly to 2018 when 3,194 incidents were tracked.

Of last year's incidents, 137 were reporteable crimes that resulted in 67 total arrests. Patrol officers issued 822 warnings and handed out 399 traffic citations – a total of 1,221 vehicles stopped. Actual number of stops would be higher when adding those that resulted in a DUI or drug arrest, and apprehension of a wanted person. Fifty-eight vehicle accidents – everything from fender benders to total losses – were logged and reported. There were 211 parking tickets issued.

#### And, a look ahead

Orwigsburg and the surrounding area are already a very desirable place in which to live and do business. With continued development of the Rt. 61 corridor, we expect the Orwigsburg economy and population to increase.

With this anticipated growth, the Orwigsburg Police Department also expects its statistical numbers to increase – perhaps not immediately, but surely in the coming years as more people and businesses see the wonderful life and opportunities Orwigsburg can offer!


Holy Week will feature a shared Maundy Thursday service at 7 p.m. with Holy Communion to be held at Frieden's Lutheran Church, New Ringgold.
