reestablish its elected and non-elected personnel, staff committees, and set the business agenda to carry the Borough through the year.

Orwigsburg Borough said good-bye and offered thanks for the time, commitment and service given by two former Council members – Katie Bedway and Rodney Schaeffer – who did not run for re-election.

Councilor Angie Hoptak-Solga was re-elected for a new 4-year term. Council President Rick Bubeck was not on the ballot; but, was re-elected by write-in vote count and then reinstated as President by vote of the full council during the January 3 reorganization meeting.

Two new members of Council – Ed Keyworth and Ed Winkelbauer – each won 4-year terms after waging successful write-in election campaigns.

## Let's Find "27 to R"

An article from the Orwigsburg Historical Society published in the November 2021 issue of *Orwigsburg Happenings* enlightened readers to the transportation



and economic lifeblood once known as the Centre Turnpike built in the nineteenth century. This highway spanned from Sunbury to Reading, and ran right through Orwigsburg.

For travelers, white marble monuments, known as Mile Stones ticked off the number of miles remaining to Reading. A number of these stones have been preserved and set

in place. To date, according to the article, there are six of these mile markers still missing from southern Schuylkill County. Stones that have recently been rescued were found repurposed as a stepping stone buried in the ground or as a step to a porch.

This prompted local history buff and Orwigsburg resident Daryl Kunkle, who owns property along the turnpike route, to issue a "challenge" to those living inside the Borough or in adjacent townships to help find Mile Stone "27 to R" (27 miles to Reading). If found, please call Orwigsburg Borough at 570-366-3103.

About the year 1810, according to Kunkle, the stone was originally placed on the northern side of East Market St., 75 feet to the east of the North Washington St. intersection (flashing traffic signal).

In a published report of Sept. 24, 1913, according to Kunkle, "Mile Stone '27 to R' was not standing" having been moved to some other location or unknown-property.

Kunkle says this Mile Stone may have been repurposed as a stoop/step, covered with leaves or soil build-up over the years. If still in one piece, he indicates the stone is five (5) feet in length, originally set 2'-6" in the ground with 3'-0" above ground. The stone is 5 inches thick, 12 inches wide and engraved with the "27 to R" marking. The stone weighs in the neighborhood of 400 pounds.

## Infrastructure Repair/Improvement Still Our Focus

Orwigsburg Borough finished 2021 operations financially in the black. Expenditures were under budget. Additionally, on the other side of the ledger, Receivables generated an overall savings transferred to reserve accounts to fund future needs.

Accomplished projects this past year included:

- Demolition of the building at 119 South Liberty St.
- Culvert repair on Long Avenue, creating a new open section of creek
- Replacement of a sewer line at Long Avenue, extending through the open areas behind the Borough's Water Treatment Plant and over to

• Stormwater upgrades and repairs along Lehigh Avenue

• Paving projects on Lee Court and Erb Street, as well as patch repairs elsewhere in the Borough

• Upgrades to Albright's Woods.



Looking ahead to 2022

As we continue to progress through this CO-VID pandemic, the Borough continues to operate and work on infrastructure. In 2022, the Borough will continue work on several projects to repair buildings and infrastructure. Plans include:

• Sewer line replacements along North Warren Street, across North Warren toward Lee Court and also west from the same location. These projects are to replace deteriorating terracotta pipes that are allowing large quantities of ground water to in-

filtrate the sanitary sewer, requiring unnecessary treatment.

- Upgrades to the Sewage Treatment Plant, located near the South Liberty St. and Rt. 61 intersection, will continue in 2022.
- Borough Hall will have its second year "face-lift." The Police Department side of the building (facing Mifflin Street), and possibly the North Warren front facade, will receive needed maintenance and upgrades.
- Stormwater infrastructure systems will again be a focus this year with multiple repairs planned in various areas of the Borough. These, along with street repairs will be handled either by our Borough maintenance department (for smaller jobs) or planned and bid-out through the Liquid Fuels funding process.
- The Veterans Foyer of Honor project at the Veterans Community Memorial Hall will be started this spring and be completed by Thanksgiving. The RACP grant for the work is in place and the notice to proceed is expected soon.
- The Appalachia grant to refurbish Industrial Drive and Long Avenue is in hand. Once the final plans are completed and approved by the Commonwealth, the project can begin. The expected start date is in the fall, with the paving to occur next spring 2023.
- North Street repairs, inclusive of stormwater problems, are on the calendar for 2022.
- And, a few other smaller projects will also be completed.

Today's technology permits our immediate and extended family to hilariously share this growing newborn's tiny but accumulating victories. Digital videos have been particularly entertaining for my father as he endures his COVID prevention detention.

Looking back through my life's experiences, no occasion caused me to give greater consideration to the future than beholding new life. It's an opportunity to reset, reboot, restart – however you wish to phrase it. My daughters' births shaped many of my actions over the past few decades.

- The Borough has reserve funds available for accomplishing these projects. Coupled with budgeted expenditures from the General Fund and Liquid Fuels account, we expect a substantial amount of infrastructure can be repaired. The Federal Government has granted, through the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act, about \$350,000 over two years.
- Several development opportunities are being eyed throughout the Borough. Some may see progress this year.

Borough Council meets twice a month, on the first and second Wednesday at 7 p.m. At present, these meetings are held in-person in council chambers on the second floor of Borough Hall. The public is welcome at each of these meetings.

During the last remnants of winter weather and always, I ask those who are able to continue to keep our elderly residents – and those who find it difficult to shovel, or haul ashes, or get out and do simple chores like shopping – in your minds and look out for them with the aid that they might need.

## Activity Recap for 2021 & Looking Ahead to 2022

The year that was, 2021! It was a time of change for the Orwigsburg Police Department (OPD). In February, Chief John Koury retired after a remarkable 30+ year career with OPD. In June, council voted to hire Vince McDonald as the department's new Chief of Police.

While leadership changed, our patrolmen continued to be proactive on the streets, resulting in 285 traffic citations, 432 warnings, and 142 parking tickets. The department recorded a total of 2,314 incidents in 2021. Ninety-six reportable crimes came from those incidents, resulting in 52 arrests.

One area we are emphasizing is an increase in foot patrol. Since most of our shifts are spent in a patrol car, people can't approach us. Walking around the community allows for a different, more informal environment to see and converse with people. We can also better notice suspicious activity such as an open door or window.

In 2021 we recorded 287 hours of foot patrol – an increase from 164.5 hours in 2020. We hope that number will grow in 2022. Officers hope you say hello when you see us out and about!

#### Neighborhood Watch goes digital

The Orwigsburg Police Department is proud to announce that we are the FIRST public safety agency in Schuylkill County to utilize the "Neighbors by

Ring" app. This free app is a digital neighborhood watch, allowing users to share pictures and video of crimes or suspicious activity. Users receive real time community safety updates – such as crimes, road closures, and reminders – from the Orwigsburg Police Department.

This app is specifically made for public safety agencies to interact with the public to share information. By using this app, it opens another line of communication for us to better protect our community and to solve crimes. Simply go to your phone's app store to download. The app doesn't require that you have any Ring products.

#### Thefts can be avoided

Stated above, Orwigsburg had 96 reportable crimes in 2021. The vast number of crimes that any police department deals with are petty thefts. Orwigsburg is no different.


Perhaps tools are taken from a garage or a wallet was taken from a vehicle. These crimes typically occur late at night and are often committed because bandits have the opportunity to commit them. Thus, they're referred to as "crimes of opportunity."

If a garage door is wide open at 2 a.m., anyone could potentially walk in and take whatever is there. If a wallet is sitting in a center console of an unlocked car, a thief can take it without anyone knowing. In both cases, it's easy for someone to commit such a crime because there's almost no risk in committing it. A thief doesn't have to do much work to steal your possessions in such cases.

While most people are sleeping late at night or early in the morning, our officers will attest that there are people awake and walking the streets at such times. Don't allow yourself to be a victim. Make sure your valuables are removed from your vehicle and that your windows are up and doors locked. In addition, make sure your garage doors are down and house doors are locked. By doing these simple tasks every night, you can help to prevent crimes from occurring and thus help us to make Orwigsburg a safer community.

A portion of this funding will be directed to the Student Loan Relief for Nurses Program, to help en-

Forms for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program are now available for eligible Pennsylvanians. Applica-

tion must be made for rebates on 2021 property taxes or rent paid.

No need to pay anyone for assistance to apply for the rebates. Help is available from my office at no charge. Call my district office in Tamaqua at 570-668-1240 or visit at 202 E. Broad Street.

The rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians, age 65 and older; widows and widowers, age 50 and older; and people with disabilities, age 18 and older. The

income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 for renters. Half of your Social Security income is excluded.

Maximum standard rebate is \$650, but supplemental rebates for qualifying homeowners can boost rebates to \$975. The Dept. of Revenue automatically calculates supplemental rebates if you qualify.

The deadline to apply is June 30. Rebates will be distributed beginning July 1, as required by law. Information and claim forms, are available by visiting the PA Department of Revenue website at *www.Revenue*. *Pa.Gov*. Search "property tax rent rebate."

## Safety Alarms from the Orwigsburg Fire Chief

## Enjoy the Winter Wonderland, But Do It Safely

I know I'm showing my age; but "ages ago" about this time of year, I remember the local TV station (now



known as WNEP) would broadcast a short public service announcement. A gentleman, named Manny Gordon, would exude "Enjoy, enjoy the winter wonderland of northeastern Pennsylvania!"

Yes, it's a fun time during the winter months for many, but I would like to remind all of a few cautions at this time of year. In your home or place of business ...

- Home fires occur more frequently in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!
- Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January, and February.
- One in every seven home fires and one in every five home fire deaths - involve heating equipment.
- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators, or space heaters.
- Keep portable generators outside, away from windows, and as far away from your home as possible.
- Install and then repeatedly test carbon monoxide alarms at least once a month.
  - Plug only one heat-producing appliance (like a

space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.

- Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents every year.
- Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep it outside at least 10 feet from your home and any nearby buildings.

#### Please clear snow/ice from fire hydrants

Anyone that has a fire hydrant on or near their property can help keep themselves, their neighbors, and the town safer - while assisting the fire depart-



- ment at the same time by keeping fire hydrants clear during the winter months.
- Remove snow/ice from a 3-foot radius on all sides of the hydrant.
- Shovel a pathway from the hydrant to the street so firefighters can access it.
- Try to remove any ice that might have formed on the hydrant itself.

Thank you for assisting the fire department keep our neighborhoods fire-safe during this winter season. See everyone in the spring!

collection to place garbage.

Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, County Waste, at 570-874-3047.

### Holiday refuse/recycling collection

The Borough contracts with County Waste for the weekly collection of refuse and biweekly recycling collection. Curbside collection is on Tuesday for properties on Market Street and north ... and on Friday for properties south of Market Street.

Collection will delay one day due to Memorial Day holiday. Tuesday pickup that week moves to Wed., June 1 and normal Friday pickup moves to Sat., June 4.

The Planning and Zoning (P&Z) Board meets, as needed, on the third Wednesday of the month, also beginning at 7 p.m. The public is encouraged to attend.

#### Declared "Snow Emergency"

Designated "Snow Emergency" routes are: all of East and West Market streets, including both sides of Centre Square; South Liberty Street from Rt. 61 to Market, North Warren Street from Market to Lehigh Avenue, and North Washington Street from the blinker light to the Borough line.

During a snow and/or ice event, the Mayor of



Orwigsburg may declare an official "Snow Emergency." Residents will be made aware of the emergency by notice posted to the Borough website and Facebook page.

Households tered with the Borough's direct notification system - Swiftreach 911 - will receive a phone call with a prerecorded message from the Borough, an email, or text message depending on which method was requested. If you have not already done so, add your contact information via the Swiftreach link on the home page of the Borough website: *Orwigsburg.gov*.

All vehicles parked on the designated "Snow Emergency" streets must be removed for a period of 24 hours once the emergency is declared or for a longer period as instructed.

Vehicles not removed, in violation of the emergency procedure, will be ticketed and will be towed. The vehicle owner is responsible for all towing costs. Ignorance of the declared emergency is not an excuse. It's your responsibility to find out.

#### Help available for heating costs

Residents struggling to pay home heating bills can begin applying for assistance from the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) now. This program runs until April 8, 2022.

The federally funded LIHEAP program helps indi-

viduals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance cash grants that are sentdirectly to your fuel/ utility provider. The program also includes Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program



crisis grants should there be an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel, or termination of utility service.

The income limit for an individual is \$19,320; for a couple, the limit is \$26,130; and for a family of four, it

is \$39,750. The grant award amounts vary from \$200 to \$1,000 depending upon income, fuel source, and household size.

Residents may apply for LIHEAP online or by contacting your County Assistance Office.

Flushing of wipes and paper towels has become a significant concern in recent times due to the shortage of toilet paper and the potential need to utilize alternate means combined with increased cleaning/disinfection recommendations by the CDC for prevention of COVID-19 and other viral respiratory illnesses in households and community settings.

Only flush toilet paper and human waste down your toilet. All other items should be thrown away with your solid trash.

## Utilites problem? Call the Borough first!

"I have a problem with my Water or Sewage system. What do I do?"

If you have a simple leak, call a plumber. But, if you have a clog and don't know why or you need to have your water turned off because of burst pipes, call the Borough Office.

Orwigsburg Borough requires all Water and Sewer utility customers to notify the Borough Office when there is any situation involving these systems requiring maintenance performed by a contractor.

For example ... if your property has an apparent clog in the waste system resulting in your need to hire a contractor (i.e. Roto Rooter, or others) to remove the clog, you must notify the Borough before you do. This will allow the Borough to perform an inspection to determine where the problem lies and to possibly resolve the problem. Failure to contact the Borough in advance may result in all costs being your responsibility.

The Borough, at its discretion, may hire the contractor ... might perform the work itself ... or, if the issue is determined to be the property owner's responsibility, recommend to the owner that they hire the contractor.

## Did the recycling truck pass you by?

"Why Wasn't My Recycling Collected?"

In order for recyclables to be truly "recyclable," the quality of the items put into your bin for collection is highly important.

- All recycling needs to be washed and rinsed of all food debris.
- Only the allowed items are to be placed into recycling. This means . . .
- No bags; No aluminum foil; No lids or caps; No

Don't overfill your recycling container. Flatten all cardboard boxes. Don't place loose recyclables adjacent to the container. If you can't close the lid tightly, the contents are subject to being spread by wind. Collectors will not pick up YOUR litter.

Current instructions and information can be found on the Borough website – *Orwigsburg.gov*! If these are not followed, the Borough's Contractor may pass YOU by.

# LIHWAP may be able to assist you with overdue water and wastewater bills.

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) is a temporary emergency program to help low income families pay overdue water bills. LIHWAP is a crisis grant. You may be eligible to receive one crisis grant for your drinking water service and one crisis grant for your wastewater service up to \$2500. You do not have to repay it.

Crisis situations include past due water bills, temination of utility service, or if you have received notice that service will be shut off within the next 60 days.

Apply online at *www.compass.state.pa.us* starting Jan. 4, 2022. Applicants can be either renters or homeowners. Request an application by calling 877-395-8930 or obtain one at your local county assistance office.

The application asks the name, date of birth, Social Security number, proof of income for each household member, and your current water and/or sewer bill.

Maximum annual income for the entire household starts at \$19,320 for a single person and allows for \$6,810 for every other person in the apartment or home.

After your application is processed, you will receive written notice if you qualify, if eligible and the amount of the grant.

## Veterans Foyer of Honor Construction to Start This Spring

Orwigsburg Borough finalized the final bid package and successfully awarded the contract for the RACP Grant in December 2021. The Borough has been working through this process since Governor Wolf announced the grant award in 2018.

The grant process and the process through the PA Office of the Budget (OB), leading to a fully executed grant, came to fruition in the fall of 2021 as the package was put out for bid and awarded to Miller Brothers Construction, the low bidder, by Borough Council this past December. Special thanks again to PA State Rep. Jerry Knowles, who championed the \$750,000 RACP Grant received.

Since the two processes are intertwined, coordination, collaboration and partnership by Orwigsburg Borough and the Veterans Memorial have required patience to assure all submitted aspects of the RACP were deemed eligible expenses; the maximum number of desired renovation elements were approved, successfully specified and bid; and that the publicly-raised funds of the Taskforce could be appropriated to complete the remainder of the project elements not authorized in the RACP process. This has been a true public/private partnership by the Borough and the Taskforce. Construction is expected to begin in the spring this year.

for the Veterans Foyer of Honor assures the appropriate recognition of all area veterans. The original intent of the building – from its conception in the late 1940s, to its dedication in 1950, through today – continues to be to honor and commemorate the great service of our veterans.

The design includes: the Veterans Honor Board, organized by named conflict; a Veterans Memorial Donor Board to recognize the major contributors to the renovations initiated in 2005, various veteran murals, a conflict timeline, and display cases for veteran and conflict memorabilia to be displayed. Eventually the original Schuylkill County Court House clock, which was once housed on a chimney tower of the original 1950 Community Memorial Building, will be proudly displayed in the Veterans Foyer following restoration by the Orwigsburg Masonic Lodge.

Task Force members have spent considerable effort finalizing the names for the Veterans Honor Board, coordinating the veterans by conflict, and clarifying the contributors for the donors board. It is anticipated the Borough and the Taskforce will post these lists for public review and accuracy in a public setting, possibly Orwigsburg Borough Hall and the Veterans Memorial Community Hall.

Levkulic Associates finalized kitchen renovation plans and the location for the propane tank on the property. Due to current supply chain delays, rising costs and labor shortages, certain construction items, such as parking lot light poles, could be delayed and some material/labor costs might be coming in high.

For 20 years at Faith Church, we have worked to develop ways for people to find their "pur-




