Precautions In-Place; Borough Operations Maintained

During this time of crisis, the health and well-being of the Borough's residents, employees and community

is our top priority. We understand the concern you may be experiencing surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic and are committed to being responsive to the needs of our residents and employees as the situation evolves. We have taken the following precautions to keep the Borough operational and safe.

The Borough offices closed to the public in March in order to protect employee and community health. The Borough continues to deliver essential

services to residents throughout the response to this pandemic.

The Borough Office staff will be at the office

and is available to answer calls and messages Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. During this time, we are providing continuous operations. The following services remain operational:



- All emergency services including Police, Fire, and Emergency Medical
- Emergency response to weather events
- Refuse and recycling collection (large item pick-up has been suspended for the time being) will continue unless a warranted stoppage occurs.

Businesses Adapt to COVID-19 Restrictions

The Pennsylvania Stay-At-Home Order to reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus has, at press time, extended now for more than two months – April 1 through June 5 in Schuylkill County.

The intent clearly is to stem the tide of the global pandemic and protect the health and safety of all residents until a treatment and future vaccine can be developed.

But it sure has put our normal lives and business economics into a tailspin, hasn't it?

Many businesses, deemed non-life sustaining, were forced to close. Some, in order to continue serving the public, were forced to modify operations and to realize a greatly reduced volume and lessor income to cover expenses.

Public schools, colleges, and universities scrambled to establish "distance learning" when required to close their doors to prevent people-to-people contact. Parents were forced to arrange for the care of youngsters at home, if they were still able to work, and to adapt to become teachers themselves in a homeschooling environment.

Many adults were furloughed or laid off due to business closures or cutbacks. Federal economic incentives through direct payments from the IRS to taxpayers and their dependents, loans to businesses (some with payback forgiveness) through the Small Business Administration, and increased Unemployment Compensation promised some financial relief. Problems due to the huge number of applications meant that relief was a long time coming, if yet!

 - Water and sewer plants will remain staffed and operational

The following facilities and operations remain closed until further notice:

- The Borough Office
- Borough parks, fields and recreation centers will be closed to external functions. As the county begins to re-open, each recreation possibility will be evaluated; however, with the Primary Election scheduled for June 2 at the Veterans' Memorial, this location will continue to be isolated until after Primary Election Day, at which time it will again be thoroughly cleaned.

We will continue to monitor the situation and take whatever steps we can to mitigate the spread and impact of the coronavirus.

Heading into summer

As we progress into summer, the Borough continues to evaluate needed repairs and upgrades to streets, sewer, water, and stormwater systems. We have several planned projects that you will notice.

The Borough has received bids for repairs to stormwater and street surfaces in Ridgeview. We are continuing the work begun to stormwater conveniences by evaluating the work completed to date and looking to effect repairs to other areas where stormwater is an issue. We know there are many locations, and we intend to fix them.

One note though – no municipality can build a stormwater system large enough to handle everything that Mother Nature can produce. Conventional engineering designs these systems to handle storms as large as a "hundred-year" storm. In some locations, elevation, storm line depths, stream locations all preclude the design capacities.

As Schuylkill County moves into the Yellow Phase of reopening, and hopefully Green before too long, please remember that safety will remain the top concern for all residents and employees. As this occurs, the Borough will be prepared to open Borough Hall, the parks, and the Memorial Building, abiding by all requirements established by the Commonwealth, and Schuylkill County.



Proclamation from the Orwigsburg Mayor

Collateral Damage – Let's get the bat off our shoulder

When I first became Mayor, I was told that my role in writing this column was to act as Orwigsburg's "cheerleader." I'll try my best to keep that notion to the forefront as I continue.

I write this note as Schuylkill County's unilateral move to Covid-19 "Condition Yellow" has been retracted rather than risking the threatened consequences of defying the Governor's orders.

It's also four days past Mother's Day, my first in 65 years without being able to celebrate it with my mother.

The toilet paper market is starting to loosen up. We all have crazy mask stories to tell. There is nothing social about staying six feet away from

everyone. Walmart, CVS, Lowe's, Target, McDonald's, Rite-Aid, Home Depot, Burger King and scores of other national businesses are doing pretty damn OK while giving lip service to "guidance."

Small businesses, particularly those deemed "nonessential," are stressed beyond limits worrying if they will be able to outlast the arbitrary goalposts placed by our elected leaders and their advisors.

My father is a medical inmate at Luther Ridge, arguably for his own good. Statewide restrictions prohibit outside contact, depriving him of our weekly dinners and play dates with Maggie (our Lab, his spoiled brat). Dad's tolerance of technology expired when he learned how to find the Golf Channel with the TV remote. He enjoys FaceTime when it's set up for him, but a phone call is as far as it goes for him on his own. A room with a very limited view is not very fulfilling for someone who deserves to enjoy his retirement.

While I'm seeing the positive signs of family activities and unstructured play, our youth are being deprived of valuable educational and social exposure. Video gaming and "Zoom" schooling are poor substitutes for sliding in to third base, getting a teacher's personal help in understanding a problem, or interacting with their peers to achieve a goal. They need things to remember and celebrate.

Do! But be safe and responsible

I believe I am capable of interpreting honest data, drawing my own conclusions, determining what risks I'm willing to accept, and conducting myself in a safe, responsible manner without jeopardizing other community members.

If someone feels that their best approach is to lock themselves in an underground bunker until the "all clear" is sounded, be my guest with my blessings. I don't think I'll be joining you, though.

By the time this issue is distributed, we will have recognized those who have fought and died to preserve our nation and its ideals with a condensed Memorial Day observance. We will have celebrated our power of consent



through a postponed primary election, complete with a new voting venue and new voting equipment.

It may not sound like it so far, but I am an optimist at heart. I hang on to what I hope will be the truth until every last glimmer is gone. To me, that means that the only acceptable "normal" is what has always been normal. "New normal" does not and will not exist in my current consideration.

I made prior mention of my mother's passing for a very specific reason. Her coroner's certificate stated "Failure to Thrive" as her cause of death. I can't help but feel that the longer we remain static, the more difficult it will be to recover.

As a Little Leaguer many years ago, my father told me he'd rather see me "strike out swinging than looking for a walk with your bat shouldered." I don't think that's bad advice for anyone at anytime.

I think it's great advice for us all under our current circumstances. Let's fight this through and strive to thrive once again.

Don't flush sanitary wipes

When store shelves became empty of everyday items, such as toilet paper, use of "flushable" wipes, disinfection wipes, paper towels, and other cleaning supplies have been put into service during the health crisis.

Orwigsburg Borough wishes to remind all that wipes – even the ones that say "flushable" – and paper towels do not break down like toilet paper does in

water. These items should never be flushed down your toilet; but, rather, should instead be thrown away with the trash.

Flushing of wipes and paper towels can cause raw wastewater backups in your home or neighborhood homes by wrapping around broken or



misaligned drain pipe joints, thus forming a clog. If these items do pass through the system, they end up at the sewage treatment plant, causing mechanical breakdowns.

Flushing of wipes and paper towels has become a significant concern in recent times due to the shortage of toilet paper and the potential need to utilize alternate means combined with increased cleaning/disinfection recommendations by the CDC for prevention of COVID-19 and other viral respiratory illnesses in households and community settings.

Only flush toilet paper and human waste down your toilet. All other items should be thrown away with your solid trash.

Refuse/recycling collection

The Borough contracts with County Waste for the weekly refuse and biweekly recycling collection. Curbside pickup is on Tuesday for properties on Market Street and north ... and on Friday for properties south of Market Street.

Keep Orwigsburg beautiful! Residents are asked to be considerate of the "streetscape" in front of their properties. Store your refuse and recycling containers to the rear or side of your building.

How do holidays affect trash/recycling?

County Waste, observes si major holidays - Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day - that may change the normal Tuesday/Friday collections.

Here are the simple Holiday Schedule Rules:

- If the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday, trash/recycling pickup will be delayed one day for every household ... Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday; Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Wednesday thru Friday, the Tuesday pickup will not be affected; but, the - Continued on page 12

Recycling electronics

Federal law prohibits landfill disposal of desktop computers, laptops, monitors and peripherals, and televisions. These electronics must be recycled during special collection events. County Waste will not take these in normal refuse or recycling collection.

Curb your animal

The Borough Office has received numerous complaints of pet owners walking their dogs and failing to clean up after defecation on both public and private property. Property owners, also, are reminded to pick up the feces of their own pets from their property within a reasonable time.

Both are public health violations as stipulated in Borough Ordinance 299 and subject to a fine up to \$600 for



each offense. The Orwigsburg Police Department has been

made aware of this growing problem by inconsiderate residents. Neighbors and property owners witnessing these violations are urged to call the police at 570-366-3101 and file a complaint.

Many residents take advantage of the parks and walking trail and are discouraged by the lack of consideration shown by some pet owners. Homeowners in the Borough who take great pride when maintaining their properties feel violated when having to clean feces left by a passing dog or roaming cat when their masters seem oblivious to the community responsibilities of pet ownership.

Now available - Credit/debit bill pay

It is the responsibility of all property owners to pay their quarterly utility bills in full by the due date printed on the invoice.

Providing our residents with a higher level of customer service, Orwigsburg Borough now accepts credit and debit card payments for

water, sewer, and trash service. Customers can make payments online at www.orwigsburg.net or at the Borough Office with major credit and debit cards.

Customers may continue to pay by cash, check or money order at the Borough Office, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Additionally, checks may be mailed to Orwigsburg Borough, 209 North Warren Street, Orwigsburg, PA 17961, or deposited in the 24/7 drop-off box located at the front door to Borough Hall.

Note: As of press time, the current closure of the Borough Office due to COVID-19 precautions has suspended in-person payment of utility bills and cash payments. Online and mail-in options are available or payment by check placed in an envelope and dropped in the "utility payment box" at the front door of Borough Hall, 209 N. Warren St.

Take care of your property

Property owners must keep all premises and exterior property free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 6 inches. All noxious weeds are prohibited.

Weeds are defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs. This regulation, however, does not include cultivated flowers and gardens.

The property owner must also address weeds appearing between sidewalk blocks and between the curb and the street.

Getting the word out

We use the Borough website *Orwigsburg.gov* as a valuable tool to keep residents and property owners informed about the happenings in the Borough. Our staff will keep the home page current with news on upcoming events and information on past events in the Borough.

The website lists borough meeting schedules. Minutes from these meetings are posted after they have been reviewed and approved by the appropriate



body. The subdivision and zoning codes are also available for all to view. Numerous forms can be accessed, including applications for Albright's Woods usage.

Trash day pickup changes will also be posted. Links to other websites, such as the Lions Club, library, churches and fire company are on the website.

The website also includes a link allowing residents to enter their contact information into the borough's Swiftreach 911 emergency notification system. This site allows the Borough to notify residents via telephone, text message and email of boil water advisories, weather emergencies or any other emergencies in a prompt manner.

Single Stream Recycling program

The Borough and County Waste Recycling, LLC have prepared updated definitions of the items that can be recycled in our biweekly recycling collection program.

A handy chart of typical recyclable items and a description of the overall program was distributed 18 months ago. If you have misplaced this insert or need another, printed copies are still available at the Borough Office or by viewing and download from the Borough website, *Orwigsburg.gov*.

Compliance with these changes by most residents has significantly improved the quality of Orwigsburg's recycling. County Waste has requested that we follow three of the guidelines more closely.

- All items placed in the bin are to be loose, no bagging!
- No styrofoam; it is not a recyclable in their program.
- Be careful not to accidently put wet items, trash, or garbage in the recycle bin.

Spring and fall are good times to rinse out the recycle bin. Flush it out and let it dry before placing recyclables back in.

Policing Efforts Modified Due to Health Concerns

It seems every aspect of society has had to make adjustments to operations to help combat the coronavirus. Law enforcement and the Orwigsburg Police Department are no exception.

We are still responding to calls, stopping cars, and making arrests; but, the way we handle these incidents

has changed. When possible, all calls are handled over the phone. Officers will only respond to a location if it is an emergency or can't be handled via phone.

The Department has always responded to all EMS calls; however, given the current pandemic, we are only responding if it is a life and death emergency or we are specifically requested by EMS.

Officers have always had nitrile gloves and patrol gloves in the event we must

search a person or otherwise protect ourselves. In addition, we were issued several N95 masks in case we have to be inside or in close proximity to another person. We also have a supply of disinfectant wipes

and sprays that are continuously used to clean our vehicles and workstations.

Service above and beyond

We recognize that coronavirus affects certain demographics more than others. One way we are

trying to serve Orwigsburg is to assist in delivering groceries and medications to those who may be older, immune-compromised, or otherwise unable to make it to the store or pharmacy.

During this time, Boyer's Food Market and other grocery stores have become swamped as workers try to keep the shelves filled due to increased demand. Through no fault of the stores, you may experience issues or delays if you typically have your

order delivered or picked up at the store.

If you are in Orwigsburg and are unable to make it out of your house due to coronavirus, please call the Orwigsburg Police and we will happily deliver your grocery order or medication.

In addition, thanks to the Orwigsburg Area Food Pantry, we have a limited number of food baskets available at our station. If you can't afford food, please contact our station and we will see that you get one.

PennDOT extensions

Due to Governor Wolfe's shutdown order, all PennDOT License Centers are closed indefinitely. As a result, all licenses, photo identification cards, and learner's permits that were set to expire on or after March 16, 2020 have been granted an extension until May 31 this year. In addition, vehicle registrations and inspections that were set to expire during or after March, have also been given an extension until May 31.

PennDOT customers are reminded that licenses and registrations can be renewed online at *www.dmv. pa.gov*. Vehicle service stations (garages) are also considered life-sustaining businesses and therefore are able to perform state inspections.

Fire Chief Urges All to Enjoy Summer - Safely!

It's time once again to finally enjoy the outdoors with warm temperatures and mild afternoons. During this time, people find themselves more involved in outdoor life.

As the temperatures climbs and the grass grows, grilling outside feels like a necessity. The Orwigsburg Fire Department would like to share a few fire safety tips to help you during the upcoming summer season.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), here are some precautions to keep in mind when grilling outside:

Propane and charcoal barbecue grills should only be used outdoors. The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railing and out from under eaves and overhanging branches. Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.

Keep the grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill. Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it and never leave your grill unattended.

Mowing and swimming safety

The NFPA also offers these fire and safety tips while using a gasoline lawn mower, generator, and swimming in pools or at recreation areas.

Always be sure your mower motor is cool before

refueling and never refuel while the engine is running. Don't over fill the gas tank causing spillage on the mower.

Store gasoline in approved containers away from ignition sources and outside of your home.

Swimmers should keep a few safety precautions in mind. Don't go in the water unless you know how to swim. Never swim alone. Consider learning CPR and rescue techniques.

Make sure the body of water matches your skill level. Swimming in a pool is much different than swimming in a lake or river, where more strength is needed to handle currents.

Don't underestimate the power of water. Even rivers and lakes can have undertows. If caught in a current, don't try to fight it. Stay calm and float with it, or swim parallel to the shore until you can swim free.

Swim only in areas supervised by a lifeguard; but remember, lifeguards aren't babysitters. If a child is missing, check the water first! Never leave your child alone. If you must leave, take your child with you.

Every pool, every lake and every warm summer day holds the possibility of new, fun summer experiences. All you need to add is your undivided attention. The Orwigsburg Fire Department wishes everyone a great summer and please be safe.

Help for First Responders

Recently, legislation that I introduced – House Bill 1189 – providing tax credits to employers who allow their employees – who are volunteer firefighters or ambulance personnel – to respond to emergencies during work hours, passed the House unanimously.

These volunteers would receive no loss in pay and





would not be required to use vacation time or sick time while serving their communities. In addition, the bill would impact other COVID-19 state-related issues including expiration dates for expired PennDOT documents.

People who are concerned about driver's licenses, vehicle registrations, and handicapped placards set to expire during this crisis would be extended until 60 days after the declaration is lifted. It would also extend ben-

efits offered by the Heart and Lung Act for police and other first responders who require quarantine because of COVID-19 by providing up to 60 days of paid leave and not requiring use of sick leave or vacation.

House Bill 1189 is now in the state Senate Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness Committee awaiting consideration.

COVID-19 Precautions Slow Project OK, Release of Funds

The Orwigsburg Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce remains focused on working with the Borough of Orwigsburg for the completion of the Veterans Community Memorial renovation.

The project has two major funding streams – (1) Community Fundraising through donations, gifts and funding events; and (2) Government Grants.

A \$750,000 grant, through the state Redevelopment

Assistance Capital Program (RACP), was approved by Governor Wolf in 2018. This set in motion the creation of a Business Plan by Alfred Benesch & Co., headed by Christopher Bentz, P.E., for the implementation, planning, bidding, awarding and construction. Orwigsburg Borough has administrative and operational authority.

The scope of work, appraisal, and revised budget was submitted in November last year. Interim financing for the project was arranged by the Borough and received in late December. The state indicated acceptability in January.

Simultaneously, the Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce commissioned TMT Design Group to follow its initial concepts to design phases 2 and 3 to establish a Veterans Foyer – Hall of Honor work schedule and updated cost estimates.

State review goes on remotely

In early April this year, the state confirmed the RACP grant application was submitted and in the PA Office of Budget. Its staff was continuing to work, but remotely due to the COVID-19 virus closure of state offices.

Though this update sounded optimistic, there has been no estimate of time for the Office of Budget review process nor final contract signing. The \$750,000 RACP funding is encumbered by the State. The taskforce hopes, in the context of the health crisis, this RACP will not and cannot be adversely affected

The Veterans Memorial Development Taskforce is hoping for the reopening of the Commonwealth in June so that the State, TMT Design Group, and the Taskforce can move forward. Christopher Bentz of Benesch & Company continues to be the "point" person for the Borough and the Taskforce.

Once signed agreements are received, bid documents will follow in 4-to-6 weeks. The Borough hopes bid requests will still go out before the end of summer 2020. Construction is anticipated to be completed one year from contract award.

Final work to be done

Combined project work, funded by local monies and the RACP grant, includes interior improvements to the main gym area and meeting room. Kitchen improvements will include new appliances/equipment and improved storage. The goal is to create a catering kitchen of approximately 500 square feet.

A permanent office and meeting space will be



provided in the building for the local veterans organizations, including the VFW and American Legion. The foyer will feature a Veterans Honor Board, listing all submitted and otherwise known local veterans by name and conflict era. All contributors to the Veterans Community Memorial Hall renovations since the inception of the renovation project, including individuals, businesses and non-profits, will be recognized. The original Orwigsburg Court House clock cupola, under restoration by the Schuylkill Masonic Lodge, will have a place in the foyer.
