

vices, quality of life, and future needs.

The results have been compiled and are in final review. The Borough received 377 responses – more than 20% of all households – mostly on the paper form but also via an identical online version. Quite evident was the time and careful thought that nearly every respondent took to provide this valuable information.

DOUBLE BONUS INSIDEGuide Map • Survey Summary

A 4-page summary sheet has been inserted in this issue of *Orwigsburg Happenings*. Public comment and discussion has been scheduled for the May 16 meeting of the Planning & Zoning Commission that will begin at 7:30 p.m. and held in the Council meeting room on the handicap-accessible second floor of Orwigsburg Borough Hall, 209 N. Warren Street.

The final 76-page report of the Greater Orwigsburg Town Survey will then be posted for public access on the borough's website *Orwigsburg.net*. The survey asked residents for specific comments on 17 different categories on the survey. The Borough received 2,020 comments, all of which have been captured and included in the final report.

One of the items summarized in the full report detailed responses to "How do residents want to find out about Orwigsburg happenings?"

In this age of social media, Facebook, and the Internet, those three categories were well down in the ranking. Not surprisingly, the most chosen source for local news was this newsletter with 45% of the 377 respondents listing it as their top choice. Newspapers were a distant second with 24%. This and dozens of other topics gauge the town's opinions.

For those who value their town of Orwigsburg – and it's obvious that number is many – the enclosed Summary and that of the full report make for very interesting reading.


Deadlines & Taxes - Ain't That A "Kick in the Pants"

I've said before, while we have little say in the disbursement of our federal and state tax dollars, virtually every tax dollar collected by the Borough




provides benefit to Orwigsburg. A safe community with functional streets, sewer systems, and water supply can best be funded by an adequate revenue stream.





Orwigsburg Street Tree Inventory Project

Planting/Maintaining Trees Benefits Our Town

Tree-lined streets in Orwigsburg provide an estimated \$43,000 in annual benefits to the community. This is the finding of a group of volunteers who conducted a street tree inventory, totaling 323 specimens, over the past year.

Each tree immediately adjacent to the street was examined to determine the species, trunk diameter, tree vigor and condition. In addition, 139 potential planting sites were identified for future plantings.

The tree inventory utilizes a free online software program

maintained by the state Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) Bureau of Forestry.

Orwigsburg street trees provide thousands of dollars of environmental, economic, and aesthetic benefits to the community. It is important to provide periodic tree care and plantings to ensure that future generations enjoy healthy and vigorous street trees.

Diversity of a town's tree species population -



no more than 5% of any one type – is important to guard against significant loss due to insects, diseases, and environmental stress that may attack a certain genus of tree. The inventory found that Norway Maple and Callery Pear trees are over-represented on Orwigsburg streets.



How you are living, working, shopping and enjoying life in Orwigsburg is important to borough officials who make daily decisions and plan for the future of your town.

One of the tools guiding these officials is a master plan for your community, known as the Orwigsburg Borough "Comprehensive Plan." This Plan undergoes a review and revision every 10 years to assure the town's direction and goals remain current with the thoughts, desires, and demands of its residents, business and property owners, and of regional trends for controlled growth, economic prosperity, and valued quality of life.

Many residents and visitors will remember last spring a "Quick Survey" was conducted in focus groups and at local restaurants by use of a drink coaster asking just three simple questions — (1) What makes Orwigsburg great?; (2) What is missing?; and (3) What needs to be improved?

An overwhelming response to this, along with data from the previous town questionaire of 2004, became the basis of The Greater Orwigsburg Town Sur-

vey distributed to every household in Orwigsburg Borough and beyond in the Fall of 2017.

Again the response was extraordinary as 377 official questionaires, representing more than 20% of households, were received via paper ballot and by identical online survey. The time, careful thought, and heartfelt critique was evident in nearly every response.

CONGRATULATIONS!

Residents have spoken. Borough officials will use these results to amend the Orwigsburg Borough Comprehensive Plan that guides the future of the town for the next decade and beyond.

Following is a 4-page summary of the survey results. The complete survey response (nearly 70 pages) with all comments submitted is available in electronic format through the Orwigsburg Borough website:

As part of the survey, residents' specific comments were solicited. The Borough received 2,020 comments on 17 different categories. Below is a brief summary of the major categories and each major comment in the category.

INFRASTRUCTURE NEEDS

The majority of comments state the streets, sidewalks and storm drainage areas need to be better maintained for residents to walk safely. Residents also would like to see handicap accessible areas.

- "Some sidewalks in the borough are not easy to walk on and are even a little dangerous."
- "Very hard to find handicap parking in square."
- "Poor sidewalks"
- "Storm drains cleaned more often."
- "Street condition/maintenance"
- "Traffic patterns"

IN-TOWN BUSINESS SERVICES

The majority of comments state a gas station would be really appreciated in town. The community wants to keep the small-town feel with quaint stores instead of chain restaurants.

- "A gas station would be spectacular!"
- "Mix of small town feel is good no need to solicit grand scale stores."
- "Local gas station is desperately needed."
- "Keep chain restaurants out. Mom and pop stores add to the small town feel."
- "Gas station needed by far every resident has to leave town to buy fuel"

EMERGENCY SERVICES — POLICE

The majority of people state the department is doing a good job but there needs to be 24 hour coverage.

- "We need 24 hour service."
- "I wish we could have 24 hour police."
- "With the addition of full time police, things would get much better."

EMERGENCY SERVICES — ORWIGSBURG FIRE POLICE

The majority of the comments mention no complaints and others feel the department can be improved.

- "Do a good job, but not enough volunteers."
- "More volunteers to reroute during emergencies"
- "We feel safe and service has been satisfactory"



Here are the simple Holiday Schedule Rules:

- If the holiday falls on a Monday or Tuesday, trash/recycling pickup will be delayed one day for every household ... Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday; Friday pickup will move to Saturday.
- If the holiday falls on Wednesday thru Friday, the Tuesday pickup will not be affected; but, the Friday pickup will move to Saturday.



Take care of your property

Property owners must keep all premises and exte-



rior property free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 6 inches. All noxious weeds are prohibited.

Weeds are defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term does not include cultivated flowers and gardens.

The property owner must also maintain weeds appearing between sidewalk blocks and between the curb and the street.

Getting the word out

We use the Borough website www.orwigsburg.net as a valuable tool to keep residents and property owners informed about the happenings in the Borough. Our staff will keep the home page current with news on upcoming events and information on past events in the Borough.

The website lists borough meeting schedules. Minutes from these meetings are posted after they have been reviewed and approved by the appropriate body. The subdivision and zoning codes are also available for all to view. Numerous forms can be accessed, including applications for Albright's Woods usage. Trash day pickup changes will also be posted. Links to other websites, such as the Lions Club, library, churches and fire company are on the website.

The website also includes a link allowing residents to enter their contact information into the borough's Swiftreach 911 emergency notification system. Seasonal Change Requires Rethink on Safety

Old Man Winter just didn't want to loosen its grip on Northeastern Pennsylvania this spring! I believe everyone was eager for spring to show its face. I'm confident it's finally here. Enjoy all that spring and summer has to offer.

Residents will be out and about enjoying walks, picnics, parties, swimming and all the rest. The Orwigsburg Fire Department reminds all to be safety-minded while engaged in these fun and relaxing activities.

Summer weather means sun, heat and humidity. Prepare and protect yourself, making sure you hydrate by drinking water before and during outdoor activity or at any time when in a hot environment. Limit exposure to sun and heat if possible or take frequent breaks.

Children and/or pets should not be left alone in vehicles ... even with windows cracked. During the heat of summer, temperatures in vehicles not moving can exceed 100 degrees.

A good reminder to prevent leaving a child without realizing it is to leave something, like your shoe or cell phone, in the back seat. There are even apps now that can remind you to check on your child every time you shut your vehicle off. More information can be obtained at www.kars4kids.org.

Better yet, how about just paying attention to

what you are doing and whom you are transporting! What greater importance is human (or pet) life?

With the summer months come swimming. Always have a buddy when swimming. Under no circumstances should a child be left alone while swimming in a pool, no matter what their age or size.

As we approach Independence Day with gettogethers and celebrations, fireworks – even just sparklers – can be a danger when not handled properly or used in ways they were not intended. Children should never be lighting fireworks. Even sparklers can give off heat up to 1200 degrees. More on firework safety can be found at www.safekids.org.

Backyard barbecue get-togethers usually include some type of open grilling. With any type of heat source, never leave it unattended; never have any type of spare fuel in the vicinity; keep anything with an open flame and heat a safe distance from anything combustible; and, always have a bucket of water, hose or some type of extinguishing agent at the ready.

When any emergency arises, quick and early activation of the 911 system will get the emergency services including police, fire, or emergency medical services there faster to assist in the time of need.

Welfare Spending and Property Taxes - We Differ!

My recent monthly television program - The Argall Report – recaps the recent state Senate Appropriations Committee budget hearings for fiscal year 2018-19.

The committee, of which I am a senior member, is tasked to review the governor's state budget proposal each fiscal year - line-by-line, program-by-program -

and to discuss key issues and concerns with each leader of the state's agencies and departments.

During this year's budget hearings, I asked the Governor's cabinet members a series of questions, including the future of state prison closings, combatting welfare fraud, and breathing new life into older towns through revitalization efforts. Also addressed is my top priority, finding a more equitable way to fund

our public school system rather than through our current property tax system.

Unfortunately, if I had to sum up this year's budget hearings, I would have to say there were a lot of lackluster answers from agency leaders and an unwill-

ingness to provide concrete plans on ways to save taxpayers money and better streamline state government and its programs.

Discussing school property tax elimination with Education Secretary Pedro Rivera, I was extremely disappointed the secretary said this issue was not a priority for his department.

This is, by far, the No. 1 issue residents contact me about. While this may not be a priority for the state bureaucracy, it is for thousands of homeowners across the state struggling to keep their homes.

Other state appointees were equally unfamiliar or unconcerned to tackle major budgetary impacts. The Labor & Industry Secretary was not familiar with the components of the welfare reform measure vetoed by the governor last October. The Revenue Secretary didn't know if his department had yet completed their years of computer modernization efforts to cross check data systems for welfare fraud detection. The Human Services Secretary refused to provide suggestions on getting able-bodied Medicaid recipients into the workforce. The Acting Secretary of the Commonwealth refused to comment on his predecessor's resignation. The list goes on and on...



Tackling the Need to Improve School Security

The House Education Committee recently held a public hearing on school safety following the Florida school shooting and a rash of bomb threats at southcentral Pennsylvania schools.

Ensuring the safety of our school students is a needed undertaking of the General Assembly. Pennsylvania Our Constitution states. "The General Assembly shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of public education to serve the needs of the Commonwealth."

Assuring a safe setting is not specifically mentioned, but is a

given. Accomplishing that isn't without challenges - the greatest hurdle being funding. Before anyone declares money should be no object, consider there are 500 public school districts and more than 6,000 school buildings. Consolidating districts probably does little to ease the problem due to the sheer vol-

ume of students and teachers that would still exist.

During the Education Committee hearing, Central York School District's business manager told the panel he examined the system of entrance and exit protocols that are in place at nearby William Penn High School. Metal detectors at all entrances of his high school would cost between \$30,000 and \$40,000 per machine plus \$150,000 to \$200,000 annually for qualified personnel to operate the machines.

Volume buying of security improvements for many school buildings could conceivably reduce costs and be more manageable. Finding a one-size-fits-all solution would be difficult.

State Rep. Keith Gillespie has introduced a bill proposal to divide the state into six geographic regions. Specific school building designs would be created for each region based on energy needs for heating and cooling, building size, average school district population in the region, layout of the building (one story versus multiple stories) and structural requirements due to climatic or geographic difficulties. In other words, making school buildings as uniform as possible going forward would seemingly make that "onesize-fits-all" goal a bit more achievable.

Another on-campus issue that was discussed involved allowing teachers to carry guns. Seventeen states currently permit teachers to be armed, but on a voluntary basis when authorized by the individual school district.

Testifiers from the Blue Mountain and Indiana Area school districts referenced FASTER (Faculty/ Administrator Safety Training and Emergency Response) – a program created by parents, law enforcement, and nationally recognized safety and medical experts to provide school staff with the knowledge, mindset and skills to stop an active killer and start treating the injured. The program, now in its sixth year, has trained nearly 1,100 teachers and staff from 225 districts in 12 states.

It's a fact that bullying is not a new phenomenon. The 21st century difference, however, is social media that allows online bullying beyond the school day. Parental adults must educate themselves about the technology children are using in order to effectively counsel them and monitor their activity.

School safety is something we all want. Defining and agreeing on the degree of safety we want and then figuring out how to pay for it is the hard part.

Kimmels Church




