

under-dedicated moment to the cause of their respective parties.



You may have followed the saga of fugitive Shawn Christy, of McAdoo, that lasted through most of the summer, ending with his capture in late September. One of the ways Christy was able to avoid capture was by stealing food, money, and vehicles. He had easy access to transportation because, in all cases, the vehicle doors were left unlocked and the keys ORWIGSBURG

were in plain view.

What does this have to do with Orwigsburg? In early August, there was a rash of vehicle break-ins that occurred in the Cresswell Acres neighborhood. They only took items from cars that were left unlocked.

Orwigsburg is a clean and safe town; however, like anywhere else there is a criminal element.

The moral of the story in both cases? These were easy crimes to commit because the thieves had easy targets. Do not feel bliss out of ignorance; feel bliss out of preparedness! Always lock your home, car, and garage.

We can only help when contacted directly. We won't respond or investigate anything posted on social media or via a third party.

Message from the Council President

Exciting Times Require Us to Address Future Needs

Even though we are heading into the months when people would prefer to hibernate due to the weather, it's hard not to feel an energy and excitement in the Borough and surrounding communities.

If you haven't noticed, the progress on the Geisinger St. Luke's Hospital, located just outside our Borough, is underway. The realization of having that facility, and all that may result from its presence, is setting in for many, including those of us on Orwigsburg Borough Council.

It's easy to imagine the lives that will be saved being that close to a facility that can provide emergency care.

Of course, with that excitement also comes fear and concern as many are worried the impact this will have on immediate development and future construction, as well as the impact on our way of life.

The hospital and its surrounding buildings will be a customer of the Borough through the purchase and delivery of water to the Schuylkill County Municipal Authority. This was a decision and agreement made four years ago, guided by our engineers and legal folks to ensure we could provide the water service they need without jeopardizing the needs of our resi-

We wanted to ensure that everyone who benefits from our utility also contributes to the operating costs of the system. This decision was not made lightly, but reached after balancing the needs of our residents and our desire to increase revenue for the Borough to help provide the services our residents expect.

Strong real estate market

But it's not just our water system that will be impacted by this development. Orwigsburg Borough currently finds itself in a hearty real estate market as reflected in increased real estate revenues from home sales. More often than not, homes go up for sale in the borough and, in less than 30 days, are sold to new

I expect the Borough to stay on this continued trajectory next year and longer with the hospital's employees and their families seeking residence nearby. Like us, they will find that Orwigsburg offers exactly what they are looking for.

With an influx of new residents and visitors to our area, we can expect the normal growing pains that may accompany that - increased traffic, stress on our infrastructure, increased crime, etc. I would like to

think that Orwigsburg's forward thinking has put us in a position to handle these stressors and I believe that Council, when it voted on its preliminary 2019 budget, took some of these issues into consideration.

Planning for future improvements

We recognize that our infrastructure is in need of major repair and upgrades as will our sewer and water plants, even more so as we increase our usage. Additionally, we voted to hire an additional police officer to ensure the Borough has 24/7 local police coverage. Residents expect that when there is an emergency and they pick up the phone to call 911, good guys in blue will show up at their door.

We certainly do not know what the future holds as far as development; but, we as a Council can assure you transparency as we move forward. It is what you should expect from your local government and is what is necessary to ensure we are spending your tax dollars wisely.

I know we all love Orwigsburg for a variety of reasons and often times residents and visitors speak of the "Mayberry appeal" our quaint little town offers. I know these latest changes are concerning to many. We don't want to lose our quaint little town; but, I ask the residents to take a leap of faith with us as we work to grow our community responsibly, so that more people can enjoy what we have come to know and love.

The designated "Snow Emergency" routes are: all of East and West Market streets, including both sides of Centre Square; South Liberty Street from Rt. 61 to Market, and North Washington Street from the blinker light to the Borough line.

During a snow and/or ice event, the Mayor of Orwigsburg may declare an official "Snow Emergency." Residents will be made aware of the emergency by notice posted to the borough website and Facebook page, through announcements on radio stations WPPA-AM and WAVT-FM, and by notice in the Republican Herald daily newspaper.

Households registered with the Borough's direct notification system – Swiftreach 911 – will receive a phone call with a pre-recorded message from the Borough, an email, or text message depending on which method was requested. If you have not already done so, add your contact information via the Swiftreach link on the home page of the borough website: www.orwigsburg.net.


All vehicles parked on the designated "Snow Emergency" streets must be removed for a period of 24 hours once the emergency is declared or for a longer period as instructed.

Vehicles not removed, in violation of the emergency procedure, will be ticketed and will be towed. The vehicle owner is responsible for all towing costs. Ignorance of the declared emergency is not an excuse. It's your responsibility to find out.

Winter fire prevention tips

The Orwigsburg Fire Department and its Fire Chief Jesse Zimmerman wish residents, businesses, and visitors an enjoyable holiday season and a healthy and safe new year. To help ensure that wish, the emergency responders urge all to heed the following fire prevention measures.

- Have your furnace, chimneys, and vents serviced by a certified technician at the beginning of the heating season.
- Install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors/ alarms and test them monthly.
- The nation returns to Standard Time on Sunday, Nov. 4. The time change of clocks in your home is a great time to change the batteries in your smoke detectors.



- Always cover your fireplace with a screen to prevent flying sparks and embers. Do not burn trash or Christmas wrapping paper in fireplaces.
- Beware of lit candles. Although they look very nice from the outside, candles are one of the leading causes of fire in the winter months.
- Space heaters are secondary heat sources and should be used in that manner with particular precautions. When using a space heater, keep all combustables, pets, and children away from the heater. A heater's use should be monitored at all times. Adding fuel to space heaters should not be done indoors and only when the unit has cooled.

Statistics show that every day, seven people die and 36 are injured in home fires, most in the absence of working smoke alarms. Sadly, children and the elderly disproportionately lose their lives. More than \$7 billion in property damage results from structure fires each year.

Single Stream Recycling Program

The Borough and County Waste Recycling, LLC have prepared updated definitions of the items that can be recycled in our biweekly recycling collection program.

A handy chart of typical recyclable items and a description of the overall program is included as a centerfold in this issue of *Orwigsburg Happenings*. This information is also available in the "Recycling" section of the borough web-

site, Orwigsburg.net. Additional printed copies are also available at the Borough Office.

Since early 2018, the worldwide recycle materials market has been in disarray. Only the best quality recycle stream sources are now acceptable. Putting anything and everything in the recycle containers is no longer acceptable. Please follow the new guidelines and clarifications.

The acceptability and/or preparation of some items has changed. Your cooperation in following these guidelines is needed to make the program practical and effective. Any future updates to the guide-



lines will be amended on the borough website.

Recycling and/or proper disposal of items not covered by our program may be found on the Schuylkill County Solid Waste website:

We have asked the county solid waste coordinator to update this site and to add more options for items with little known local recycling or reuse options.

Refuse/recycling collection

The Borough contracts with County Waste for the weekly collection of refuse and biweekly recycling collection. Curbside collection is on Tuesday for properties on Market Street and north ... and on Friday for properties south of Market Street. Up to six bags of



trash are allowed each week.

Pickup will be delayed one day for residents with Friday pickup due to the Thanksgiving holiday. That pickup for properties south of Market Street will be on Saturday, Nov. 24. Christmas and New Year holidays will affect both collection days – normal Tuesday pickup will move to Wednesday and normal Friday pickup will be on Saturday both weeks.

Cut Christmas trees will be picked up curbside on scheduled days, a part of your normal trash collection, after the holidays. Trees should be void of ornaments, stands, or needle collection bags.

Disposal of leaves and yard waste

Your curbside trash collection/disposal allows up to 10 bags of leaves each week. Sticks and branches should be broken in short pieces and bundled/tied together and placed beside your trash for normal pickup.

Leaves and debris in the street gutter of your property are your responsibility and must be raked and bagged for collection. If residents fail to clean their street gutter, the debris will clog storm drains and present a hazard.

Monthly large item pickup

One large item (furniture, etc.) may be placed at the curb beside your regular trash once per month. The collection date is the second Tuesday of each month for residents north of Market Street and

the Friday following the second Tuesday for residents south of Market Street.

Residents should place trash at the curb anytime after 6 p.m. on evenings prior to collection. Because pickup times vary, do not wait until the morning of collection to place garbage.

Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, County Waste, at 570-874-3047.

Orwigsburg Area Food Pantry

The Orwigsburg Area Food Pantry is housed at St. John's UCC, 232 E. Market St., and is connected with eight area churches. Non-perishables or monetary donations are always needed. Distribution to qualified individuals and families is made the third Saturday of each month from 9 to 11 a.m. Call the Pantry at 570-366-2255 for more information, need, or to help in any way.

Indoor and outdoor event rental spaces

Do you need an event space for an upcoming family reunion, holiday or birthday party, business meeting, or other gathering?

Outdoors, the pavilion at Albright's Woods on Grove Street is available for rent. The park has a pavilion with picnic tables and a kitchen available for use. Rental fee for the kitchen is \$75, \$25 of which is a returnable security deposit. If the kitchen is not needed, a \$25 fee is charged. Indoors, facilities at the Veterans Community Memorial Hall can be rented.

Now available - Credit/debit bill pay

As this newsletter is being published, the due date for quarterly utility bills is fast approaching. It is the responsibility of all property owners to pay their bills in full by the due date printed on the invoice.

Orwigsburg Borough now accepts credit and debit card payments for water, sewer, and trash service. Customers can make payments online at *www.orwigsburg.net* or at the Borough Office with major credit and debit cards.

The Borough utilizes the services of MuniciPAY with Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, or e-check. A user fee of 2.45% or \$3, whichever is greater, will be assessed per transaction. The fee for e-check is \$1.50.



The Borough does not collect, receive or retain any portion of the service fees. The fees are charged by MuniciPAY in order to provide the service. MuniciPAY is an electronic payment processing option currently used by local Schuylkill County municipalities designed specifically for local government and utility agencies.

Customers may continue to pay by cash, check or money order at the Borough Office, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Additionally, checks may be mailed to Orwigsburg Borough, 209 North Warren Street, Orwigsburg, PA 17961, or deposited in the 24/7 drop-off box located at the front door to Borough Hall.

Questions concerning these payment options may be directed to *kathi@orwigsburg.net* or call 570-366-3103.

The Borough relies on these payments in order to meet the debt service and operating costs for the water, wastewater and sanitation services. If a bill is not paid after a short grace period, collection efforts will be initiated. If efforts to collect payments are unsuccessful, additional steps could include interruption of service and/or a lien placed on your property. Property owners are responsible for all costs incurred to collect past due obligations.

To avoid these actions and additional costs, property owners must make payment arrangements with the Borough. Have accounts up to date or a payment arrangement in place by then to avoid loss of service.

Financial Needs Threaten Society's Future

The Board of Directors has submitted this open letter to the greater Orwigsburg community of residents and businesses, explaining the financial situation that threatens the future of the Orwigsburg Historical Society & Museum.

Thank you to all who have focused their interest and continued support of the Orwigsburg Historical Society & Museum through donations of time, labor, physical and verbal additions to our historical collection, membership, and financial support. You are truly appreciated!

Like many non-profit organizations, our Society struggles each and every day to raise funds in order to provide valuable services to the community of Orwigsburg, all of southern Schuylkill County, and to individuals who trace their heritage back to our little "Burg."

In addition to providing many of these services, the Society continues to preserve its two historic buildings – the original 1891 Friendship Hose Co. No. 1 firehouse and the "Old Orwigsburg Jail" to the rear of the property along Church Street. Building maintenance of old structures is a hefty and very expensive undertaking that strains our annual budget.

And, of course, regular monthly bills for insurance, electricity, only basic phone service, oil (ouch!), general supplies, and all of the other things neces-

sary to enable us to open our doors add to the fiscal need. Since the old system of "bartering" is no longer in existence, our Society must pay for all of this with actual money.

Contrary to what many assume, there are very few support grants currently available. Those that do exist are highly competitive, very specific, and are never available to small historical societies for needs such as a new roof, boiler repairs, drainage problems, and monthly bills.

Your contributions keep us going

Honoring Our Veterans and Rebuilding Memorial Hall

In 1950, a group of patriotic citizens from Orwigsburg came together to dedicate a new memorial hall that would serve as a gathering place for the citizens of the community. On the day of the dedication, more than 2,000 people flocked to the new building and listened to the keynote address given by Pennsylvania Governor James H. Duff.

From that moment on, the Orwigsburg Veterans Community

Memorial Hall would host the people of Orwigsburg for varied functions and serve as a reminder of the ultimate sacrifice that so many have made to ensure our freedoms.

In the almost 70 years that this building has been standing, it has entertained generations of Orwigsburg residents. The interior open area seats more than 1,500 people and features a basketball court while the outdoor recreation area includes baseball fields, a playground, and an addi-

tional basketball court.

As the years passed, a lack of significant maintenance had taken its toll on the building resulting in much of the Hall falling into disrepair. In an effort to breathe new life into the building, public officials and the Orwigsburg Veterans' Memorial Development Taskforce have been working tirelessly to ensure the future use of the Hall.

As part of that ongoing effort, we announce that the Hall just received \$750,000 from Pennsylvania's Redevelopment Capital Assistance Program. We also need to thank all of the volunteers who never gave up on supporting this worthy project and who also recognized the value of this tremendous regional asset.

These funds serve as another shining example of a successful private-public partnership where elected officials and community leaders can work together to achieve a common goal.

This money will be used to complete various interior and exterior improvements to the Hall. In addition, these funds will also be used to complete the Veterans Foyer of Honor recognizing all area veterans and the renovation project contributors.



Though the \$750,000 in grant money is a huge victory for the Orwigsburg Community, it is now up to all of us to complete the final lap of the race. 




Catch the Santa Trolley at Festival of Lights


