## Orwigsburg Heritage Celebration is Sat., Sept. 6

"Honoring the Past – Embracing the Future" is the theme of this year's new Orwigsburg Heritage Celebration to take place Saturday, Sept. 6 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. This year's event features a new location, new sponsors, new entertainment, new vendors and the renewed theme focusing on "heritage."

Sponsored by the Orwigsburg Business and Professional Association and the Orwigsburg Community Revitalization Committee,

the celebration's venue has been upgraded. The Community (M&T Bank) Lot on Market Street will still be home to the main stage and some wonderful food vendors. Additional vendors and entertainers will extend up North Warren St. and onto Mifflin Street, allowing these streets to be closed to vehicles and opened to pedestrians to safely "party in the street."

This Mifflin Street extension will surround the old Friendship Fire Company, now home to the

#### Catch a ride on the trolley

A new feature this year will be a Historic Trolley Tour, sponsored by Riverview Bank. St. Paul's Lutheran Church will sell pies and the always popular Apple Fest celebration will be held at the St. John's UCC Fellowship Hall on East Market St.



## Message from the Council President

## \$1 Million Sewer Line Replacement Project OKd

The major topic of recent borough council meetings has been what to do about our sewer system issues. Over the past several years, the borough staff

and our engineering firm went through several steps to help eliminate all potential sources of significant inflow and infiltration plaguing our system.

Pipes and manholes with known problems were repaired. Inspections of all properties in the borough were done to correct and eliminate rainwater from entering the system. Even though these efforts greatly reduced flow to the sewer plant during

storms, it was not enough to eliminate the problems. During heavy rains, several residents cannot flush their toilets, manholes surcharge, and the plant still experiences larger than ideal peak flows.

The borough engineer identified one of the two main lines leading to the sewer plant as a major culprit. It runs from Ridge Road to the plant along Mahannan Creek. It is an older pipe that is nearing the end of its lifespan, and most likely has several areas where groundwater is entering the pipe during

storms. This pipe is 12 inches in diameter, but the pipe leading into it is 18 inches, creating a bottleneck and further contributing to the problem. Finally, the pipe has poor access; so if there is a problem, crews will have difficulty repairing it.

Given all of the issues with this pipe, the engineer recommended abandoning it with a new pipe constructed along South Liberty Street. This will be large enough to replace the pipe along the creek and one that currently runs along South Liberty Street. It will improve flow to the plant and eliminate the problems noted above.

The estimated cost of the project is \$1 million. The borough will use \$200,000 in reserve funds, and the sewer authority will match with \$200,000 for the down payment. The additional amount will be financed. According to our estimates, a rate increase is most likely not necessary. As a result of paying off a loan within the past year and a projected surplus in the water budget, we will be able to make loan payments using our existing cash flow.

Borough council voted unanimously to approve the project. We estimate this project to be completed in 2015. A map illustrating the sewer replacement project area can be viewed on the borough's website: www.orwigsburg.net.

#### Join the ranks of the fire police

It seems many are confused about the role Fire Police play and who they are. A fire police officer is a volunteer firefighter who has been sworn by their local municipality to provide traffic control, security and crowd control. Fire police are most closely tied to their fire department, but also follow instructions given by local and state police.

Traffic control consists of managing the flow of vehicles around or through the immediate vicinity of an emergency. This may be closing roads, detouring traffic, reducing the number of travel lanes or control

of intersections.

Crowd control - residents, owners, occupants, relatives, transients, spectators and the media are among those who may approach the scene of an incident. Fire police prevent them from being harmed or hampering the work of emergency services personnel working at the scene.

Scene security – a fire police officer may be asked to provide scene guardianship in order to preserve evidence, or prevent theft.

Fire police are called upon to perform these du-

ties in both emergency (fires and accidents) and nonemergency situations (parades and public events).

All of the above activities are meant to keep everyone safe.



To prepare someone for fire police work, there are many specialized training classes available. Subjects range from basic and advanced fire police, legal concepts, highway incident scene safety and management, emergency operations, non-emergency operations, public relations, hazardous

material awareness and emergency vehicle operation. There are many on-line courses and refreshers available as well.

#### Market Street resurfacing.

Resurfacing of Market Street (PA 443) from the Rt. 61 jughandle to Lincoln Avenue (post office) by PennDOT is scheduled to begin this week. Storm water inlets will be repaired and curb ramps installed

at the intersection of Market and Lincoln inside the Borough.

Last month PennDOT received bids to extend the Market Street resurfacing through the Borough from Lincoln Avenue to North Washington St., then Rt. 443



to McKeansburg and ending at Rt. 895. This paving is expected to begin August 25 with much of the work to be done from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. at night. Inside the Borough, curb ramps will be upgraded under separate contract to be awarded in the next two years.

#### Independence Square

The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency (PHFA) approved funding for the conversion of the vacant Fessler Knitting Mill into elderly apartments. The plan calls for converting the building into 20 apartments with additional space available for a permanent home for the Orwigsburg Free Public Library.

The Borough expects the transaction to close by the end of the year with construction starting immediately thereafter. This is valuable progress seeing an empty building put to a good use that will provide benefits to the entire community.

#### Wipes clog pipes

Many companies now produce bathroom cleansing wipes, toddler wipes, sanitary wipes, and hard surface cleaning wipes. The companies state the wipes can simply be flushed down the toilet. Many of these wipes do not break down in the wastewater system and are causing major expense for the wastewater treatment plants and also for the homeowner.

The wipes have a variety of mesh materials to make them stronger. This will prevent the wipes

from breaking down. Consumer Reports tests reveal that toilet paper disintegrated in eight seconds while many of the wipes still had not broken down after thirty minutes. This will cause the wipes to block lines, causing flow backup and the need for the line to be unblocked. Please do not flush these wipes down your toilet.

#### Refuse collection

The Borough contracts with Kreitzer Sanitation for the weekly collection of refuse. Curbside collection is every Tuesday for properties on Market Street and north and every Friday for properties south of Market Street.

Pickup will be delayed one day the week of September 1 due to the Labor Day holiday. Pickups will be Wednesday, Sept. 3 instead of Tuesday and Saturday, Sept. 6 rather than

The Borough has adopted the International Property Maintenance Code which requires refuse kept outdoors to be stored in a leak proof container with a close-fitting cover.

#### Large item disposal

One large item may be placed at the curb beside your regular trash once per month.

Construction materials (shingles, drywall, cabinets, insulation, etc.) may not be placed at the curb with your regular trash. You must get a dumpster which can be leased from the borough's trash collector, Kreitzer Sanitation at 570-366-6360.

#### Recycling electronics

The Covered Device Recycling Act of 2010 prohibits landfill disposal of desktop computers, laptop computers, computer monitors, computer peripherals and televisions. If these items are placed on the curb for pickup, Kreitzer Sanitation will not take them. Schuylkill County will accept the items for recycling during its annual fall cleanup at various locations throughout the county.

Residents may also take computers and components to Staples in Cressona. TVs up to 32 inches may

be taken to Best Buy stores in Reading, Harrisburg and Wilkes-Barre.

Electronics recycling events are held periodically by the Schuylkill County Office of Solid Waste. When dates and locations are known they will be posted on the borough website and Facebook page.

#### Dumpster? You need a permit

Any resident who rents a dumpster and places it on the street is required to fill out a dumpster permit prior to dumpster delivery. Permits are available at the borough office at a cost of \$5. The permit is good for three weeks; another permit is required for additional time. Four (4) reflectors are required on each side of the dumpster,

and dumpster wheels must be placed on 3/4" thick pieces of wood so as not to damage the road surface.

Help us to help you

It shall be the responsibility of property owners in the Orwigsburg Borough to number their buildings. The number needs to be placed over/under each front door, or front transom bar or glass or front show window, over or on either side of the entrance or upon a permanent standard, base or support between building and street. The number is to be of paint, metal, enamel, plastic, or other weather resistant material and at least three inches in height, the color of the

numbers to be in contrast to the immediate background, and shall be so placed as to be in full view and legible from the street. No numbers shall be covered with any sign, drapery, or other obstruction and all old numbers shall be removed when a new number is assigned.

#### Proper disposal of Old Glory

Used flags may be brought to the borough office for proper disposal. Place flags inside the designated mailbox-like container in front of the borough building.

#### Request for cones

Cones are available for use from the Borough. A cone request form

must be filled out and is available from the borough office. Forty-eight hours notice must be given to allow time to get the cones delivered to their location and signs to be made to be placed on the cones.

#### Owner/tenant forms

Reminder to all landlords: Orwigsburg Borough Ordinance #396 requires that every owner/lessor of any apartment, house or other type of rental building shall register with the Borough every year. If any tenant moves from the dwelling during the year, the owner shall notify the Borough within thirty (30) days of said changes. Forms are available at the borough office

or from the borough website: www.orwigsburg.net
In addition, landlords living in excess of 20 miles
from the Borough must designate a local manager

for the property. This individual must live within 10 miles of the borough.

#### Albright's Woods

There is still time to book a fall event at our community park. The pavilion at Albright's Woods is available for rent for your celebration party,



family reunion or other event. Albright's Woods is located on Grove Street in Orwigsburg. The park has a pavilion with picnic tables and a kitchen available for use. Rental fee for the kitchen is \$75, \$25 of which is a returnable security deposit. If the kitchen is not needed, a \$25 fee is charged. For further details or to make a reservation to use the park, call the borough office at 570-366-3103.

#### Take care of your property

Property owners must keep all premises and exterior property free from weeds or plant growth in excess of 6 inches. All noxious weeds are prohibited. Weeds are defined as all grasses, annual plants and vegetation, other than trees or shrubs provided; however, this term does not include cultivated flowers

and gardens.

The property owner must also maintain weeds appearing between sidewalk blocks and between the curb and the street.

#### Curb your animal

Borough Ordinance 299 prohibits pet owners from allowing their pets to defecate on another property without removing the feces from that property. Those violating this ordinance can be fined up to \$600.

Many residents take advantage of the parks and walking trail and are discouraged by the lack of consideration shown by some pet owners.

#### Getting the word out

We use the Borough website www.orwigsburg.net as a valuable tool to keep residents and property owners informed about the happenings in the Borough. Our staff will keep the home page current with news on upcoming events and information on past events in the Borough.

The website lists borough meeting schedules. Minutes from these meetings are posted after they have been reviewed and approved by the appropriate body. The subdivision and zoning codes are also available for all to view. Numerous forms are also available, including applications for Albright's Woods usage. Trash day pickup changes will also be posted. Links to other websites, such as the Lions Club, library, churches and fire company are on the website.

The website also includes a link allowing residents to enter their contact information into the borough's Swiftreach 911 emergency notification system. This site allows the Borough to notify residents via telephone, text message and e-mail of boil water advisories, weather emergencies or any other emergencies in a prompt manner. In 2013 we also used the emergency notification system to remind residents to be careful when they are solicited by people they don't know for utility services or home repairs.

Data Update Form and return it to Borough Hall. The office will update your information for you. The Borough also takes advantage of Social Media to provide information. "Like" the Borough on its Facebook page and stay up-to-date with what is happening in your community. Emergency information can also be received via Twitter by following @ OrwigsburgMgr.

#### Meter reading

Many water meters are read from a remote reading register attached to the building and connected to the meter. Borough Ordinance 310 requires these units be

accessible to the Borough. Landscaping around your remote reading register needs to be maintained so as to not restrict free access.

#### **Utility bills**

As this newsletter is being published, the due date for quarterly utility bills is fast approaching. It is the responsibility of all property owners to pay their bills

in full by the due date printed on the invoice.

The Borough relies on these payments in order to meet the debt service and operating costs for the water, wastewater and sanitation services. If a bill is not paid after a short grace period, collection efforts will be initiated. If efforts to collect pay-



ments are unsuccessful, additional steps could include interruption of service and/or a lien placed on your property. Property owners are responsible for all costs incurred to collect past due obligations.

To avoid these actions and additional costs, property owners must make payment arrangements with the Borough. Have accounts up to date or a payment arrangement in place by then to avoid loss of service.

Convenient, single-stream curbside recycling is available to residents every two weeks on the designated trash pickup day. Recyclables should be separated from other household trash and placed in the container provided by the Borough and Kreitzer Sanitation, or in a container of the property owner's choice clearly designated for recycling.


Single-stream recycling means items can be co-mingled in one container/recycle bin without the need for separation.

Materials for recycling are collected curbside every two weeks on your designated trash pickup day (see calendar schedule above). Simply place your re-

cycling bin beside your other trash containers and yard waste.

Use the following guidelines to prepare recyclables for pickup:

- Newspapers and mixed paper should be bundled or placed in a paper or clear plastic bag in order to keep them secure.
- Cardboard should be flattened and bundled.
- Take steps to ensure paper, cardboard and plastic, etc. do not blow around to neighboring properties or streets.
- Glass food and beverage containers are recyclable and include items such as glass soda, beer, wine, liquor, ketchup or juice bottles, and glass food containers. Metal caps and lids should be removed, but labels can remain.





## Single-Stream Recycling

- Glass items such as mirrors, ceramic cups and plates, crystal, clay flower pots, light bulbs, window glass, drinking glass and heat-resistant ovenware are NOT recycled by glass container plants and should not be mixed in with container glass.
- Aluminum beverage cans should be rinsed and crushed. Steel cans need only be rinsed. Leave labels in place.
- Plastic soda bottles and milk jugs should also be rinsed and crushed.
- Be considerate of the streetscape view in your neighborhood; store your recycling container to the side or back of your property or residence.

After following these instructions, combine all materials in one recycling container and place curbside after 6 p.m. the evening before pickup. Recyclables must be in their special container separate from household trash because a separate collection truck is used.

Given the convenience of single-stream recycling, the number of occupants in your household, and the volume collected for recycling, residents may find the need for a smaller or larger container. The borough has two sizes available.

Contact the Borough Office at 570-366-3103 during phone office hours 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday to arrange for a different recycling container or for additional information.

## Building Improvements Take Shape; Funding Still Needed

Exterior improvements on the Veterans Community Memorial Hall on Grove Street near North Washington

have begun and will be substantially completed before the cold weather arrives.

Through funding provided by two separate grants, Orwigsburg Borough support, and task force dollars, two separate contracts have been awarded to local contractors based on the sealed bids they submitted.

Spotts Brothers Construction, will install a new metal roof and insulation system. L&K Construction, will install a new entryway on the front corner of the building and install new doors, windows and exterior façade improvements on the existing building.

At the completion of these two contracts, the exterior of the building will be relatively complete with the exception of future lighting improvements. This work will provide a weatherproof and energy efficient building. Say goodbye to the drab cinder block exterior.

A few upcoming projects yet to be tackled include a lighting/electrical contract and finishing the interior for the new entryway. The commercial kitchen upgrade is another stand-alone project targeted for next year or beyond ... with about \$100,000 needed for that effort.

Additional site work – outdoor basketball court, concrete curbs, sidewalks, play equipment, drainage

and stormwater improvements, parking, and access – is still required with funding applications being prepared.

The final element to complete the project will be the display area to honor and remember all the veterans who have served our country and who are at the heart of the original dedication of this building.

#### Derby Day

The development task force had a very successful "Derby Day" on July 19. The all-ages Home Run Derby event at the Little League field in the morning was a fun time for the 125 people who attended and/or participated in the event. Young boys and girls, as well as men in their 60s, took a chance at hitting a few home runs and winning their division.

That evening, about 120 people attended the Kentucky Derby themed semi-formal event at the Schuylkill Country Club with many silent and live auctions raising nearly \$30,000 for future building improvements, a huge success.

## Senate Committee Takes a Bite Out of Blight

For the past year-and-a-half, I have served as the chairman of the Senate Urban Affairs and Housing Committee. The committee went on a fact-finding mission going right to the source - holding three public hearings across Pennsylvania to learn more about issues affecting communities large and small

- and focused on two key issues,

money and blight.

While much of the focus in June was on the state budget, the Senate Urban Affairs and Housing Committee passed several proposals targeting the problems plaguing downtown growth and revitalization, along with boosting the housing markets in areas in need.

Strengthening penalties

Property owners and landlords who have two serious code violations within a municipality could be subject to

fines of \$1,000, at least six months of probation, and a potential 10 days of imprisonment based on the proposal that the committee unanimously approved.

Another proposal the committee passed would allow the state's Department of Transportation to suspend a property owner's driver's license if the owner is guilty of three serious violations within a municipality. This targets the worst-of-the-worst property code violators across the state.

#### Investing in housing

Several properties in each of our communities across the county may be beyond the state of disrepair. The cost to rehabilitate these properties far outweighs the cost of demolition. I put together a bill that would place a small additional amount on every deed or mortgage recording fee within a county to be used exclusively for demolition within that county. Additionally, the committee advanced a bill that would place up to 10 percent of a final sale price of a property sold at judicial sale to be used exclusively for demolition and rehabilitation purposes within that specific county.

These two funding streams would provide help where it is needed the most - in counties with higher proportions of blight - and would leave a lot of the decisions to local

and county governments on how to best utilize the investments.

Finally, the committee advanced legislation to utilize future Realty Transfer Tax revenues towards a statewide Housing Trust Fund. This fund, which is capped at \$25 million,

would help with rental housing rehabilitation, blight remediation and homelessness assistance in communities large and small.

All of these proposals have broad, bipartisan support in an effort to continue our ongoing "War on Blight."

Locally, the former Fessler Knitting Mill will be transformed into housing for senior citizens and a new space for the library. This is just one example of blight being fought in our communities.

Blight comes in many forms and the goal is to continue to provide more teeth to take major bites out of blight affecting communities across Schuylkill County and Pennsylvania. I'm optimistic Orwigsburg can continue to utilize tools and programs to make the community a better place to live, work and raise a family.
